A RESOLUTION APPOINTING STEVE GLENN AS A MEMBER OF THE JACKSONVILLE POLICE AND FIRE PENSION BOARD OF TRUSTEES' FINANCIAL INVESTMENT AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE, REPLACING ARLIE R. "RODNEY" VAN PELT, PURSUANT TO SECTION 121.503, ORDINANCE CODE, FOR A PARTIAL FIRST TERM ENDING MARCH 1, 2022 FOLLOWED BY A FULL FIRST TERM ENDING MARCH 1, 2025; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Committee members must also be residents of Duval, Nassau, St. Johns, Baker or Clay County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the five members of the Committee are nominated by the Board and confirmed by the Council; and

WHEREAS, at its September 17, 2021 meeting, the Board nominated Steve Glenn to be appointed as a member of the Committee, as evidenced by Police and Fire Pension Fund Resolution 2021-09-17-VI-B, a copy of which have been placed On File with legislative services; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appointment. The Council hereby appoints Steve Glenn, a Clay County resident, to the Financial Investment and Advisory Committee, replacing Arlie R. "Rodney" Van Pelt, in accordance with Section 121.503, Ordinance Code, for a first partial term expiring on March 1, 2022, followed by a first full term expiring on March 1, 2025. Section 2. Effective Date. This resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
