Bill Summary: This bill is an appropriation of \$1,952,892.05 in revenue collected by the Foreclosure Registry (including \$706,332.00 in new revenue collected from the Foreclosure Registry and a reallocation of previously appropriated funds for \$1,245,560.05). The funds are collected from a fee levied on mortgages on properties that are in default and will cover the various programs that are authorized under Chapter 179, *Ordinance Code*. This bill allows the reauthorization of 4 FTE positions (Housing Property Administrator, Neighborhood Administrative Manager, Housing Property Coordinator, Housing Property Analyst) within the Housing, and Community Development Division of the Neighborhoods Department as initiated by B.T. 22-026.

Background Information: The funding is comprised of \$706,322.00 in revenue collected from the Foreclosure Registry and a reallocation of previously appropriated funds for \$1,245,560.05. Per Chapter 179, *Ordinance Code*, the funds from the registration program may be used to help protect neighborhoods from becoming blighted through the lack of adequate maintenance of properties that are in default or defaulted, to help identify areas that may become blighted due to foreclosure trends in geographic areas of the City and to provide a mechanism to avert foreclosure actions through timely intervention, education, or counseling of property owners.
