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ORDINANCE 2021-891

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT (FIND) GRANTS; AMENDING SECTION 117.110 (FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT (FIND) GRANTS), CHAPTER 117 (GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REQUIRE THAT THE MAYOR NOTIFY COUNCIL OF EXCESS FUNDS IN THE FIND MATCH ACCOUNT AFTER FIND APPROVAL OF ANNUAL PROJECTS AND TO REQUIRE THAT THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT FILE LEGISLATION TO TRANSFER THE EXCESS MATCH FUNDING TO A SPECIAL CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT FOR COUNCIL WATERWAYS IMPROVEMENTS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Section 117.110 (Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Grants). Section 117.110 (Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Grants), Chapter 117 (Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to add new language regarding use of FIND matching funds, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 117 GRANTS

117.110 Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Grants.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Chapter, or otherwise set forth in the Ordinance Code, the City of Jacksonville shall not apply for any Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) grant without first securing a resolution of support and approval

from the City Council, which resolution shall be submitted with the grant application, or in accordance with FIND requirements.

Should the amount appropriated by Council for FIND grant match funding in the annual budget or through other legislative action for a particular fiscal year exceed the match amount that is required by FIND or other state regulations to be made available by the City, this fact shall be disclosed by the Mayor to the Council in writing within 14 days from receipt of communication of final annual award from FIND.

Thereafter, the Council President shall file legislation appropriating the excess funding from the FIND matching funds account to a special council contingency account to be spent within the current fiscal year on construction/improvement, maintenance or repair projects that benefit access to public waterways within the city (such as docks (including repairs), boat launches, ramps and bulkheads). The Administration shall submit a resolution to Council, for Council approval, with a list of proposed projects that will be completed with the excess funding.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
