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ORDINANCE 2021-890

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A CITY MATCH OF THE TOTAL REMAINING FUNDS (CURRENTLY \$267,798.00) FROM THE AES CEDAR BAY SETTLEMENT STIPULATION ACCOUNT FUND TO CONTRIBUTE TOWARD ACQUISITION COST OF APPROXIMATELY 345± ACRES ON BLACK HAMMOCK ISLAND BY THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND WHO, AFTER ACQUISITION, WILL CONVEY THE LAND TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA AND THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES "PROJECT"); APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND TO SET FORTH PAYMENT BY THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR A REVERTER OF FUNDS IF THE ACQUISITION FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES OF ALL, OR A PORTION OF, THE PROPERTY IS NOT COMPLETED BY DECEMBER 31, 2024; PROVIDING FOR THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO OVERSEE THE PROJECT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an approximately 345±-acre parcel of land, containing 1.6 miles of frontage on Pumpkin Hill Creek and 0.25 miles on Sawpit Creek (the "Property"), with access to the Intracoastal Waterway, is under contract by The Trust for Public Land ("TPL") to purchase for conservation and passive recreation such as hiking, wildlife viewing, and fishing; and

WHEREAS, the Property lies within the Nassau River-St. Johns River Marshes Aquatic Preserve and is designated as a Florida Outstanding Water; and

WHEREAS, the Property's natural cover will protect the water quality of the Nassau and St. Johns Rivers and ensure the survival of aquatic plants and animals as a refuge; and

WHEREAS, the Property contains abundant wildlife, including white-tailed deer, turkey, gopher tortoise, fox squirrels, pocket gophers, red-tailed hawks, fox and various forest-dwelling songbirds; and

WHEREAS, the resources upon which such wildlife depends is under threat of conversion to a residential subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the Property was on the original list for acquisition as part of the City's Preservation Project Jacksonville Land Acquisition Program beginning in 2002 but was never obtained because the owners were unwilling to release their beautiful land; and

WHEREAS, TPL has formed a partnership with the State of Florida Division of State Land and the National Park Service to pursue the acquisition of the Property to conserve this immense parcel and its pristine coastal hammocks and marshlands; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition plan and tasks for TPL are as follows:

(1) appraise the Property and enter into a contract (complete); (2) prepare and present the acquisition proposal to Florida's Governor and Cabinet sitting as the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund for acquisition funding for the major portion of the Property (February 2022); (3) acquire the entire 345±-acre Property and convey a major portion of the Property to the State of Florida; (4) prepare and execute a Letter of Intent with the National Park Service addressing acquisition funding for the balance of the Property (funding decision by the federal government anticipated by the fourth quarter 2022); (5) convey the balance of the Property to

the National Park Service upon verification of the federal appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville has received funds from the Settlement Stipulation regarding the <u>AES Cedar Bay</u>, <u>Inc. and Seminole Kraft Corporation v. Department of Environmental Regulation</u>, <u>City of Jacksonville and Department of Community Affairs</u>, et al. (the "AES Funds") lawsuit; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Settlement Stipulation, use of the AES Funds are limited to the acquisition of environmentally sensitive lands within or adjacent to the Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve with preference given to larger parcels which can be purchased using contributions from other entities, such as the State of Florida and the National Park Service, to supplement the funds available through the AES Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Property meets the criteria for utilization of the AES Funds; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b), as shown in **Exhibit 1**, attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

- 27 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:
 - The funding above represents an appropriation of \$267,798, plus the interest accrued, from the AES Cedar Bay Settlement Stipulation Account as described in Sec. 111.130, Ordinance Code, for the City's contribution to

the acquisition of the Property by TPL, who will convey the Property to the State of Florida and the National Park Service for the Property to be put into conservation for passive recreation and as an addition to the City's Seven Creeks Recreation Area.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this appropriation is to contribute the total remaining AES Funds (currently \$267,798) to TPL at the time that TPL acquires the Property. As state and federal funds become available, TPL will convey the Property for ownership and conservation stewardship to the State of Florida and the National Park Service. A map of the Property showing it in context to the neighboring city, state and federal lands is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated by reference herein.

Agreement. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized, to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, that certain Grant Agreement (the "Agreement"), substantially in the form as attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated by reference herein.

Section 4. Reverter. In the event all or a portion of the Property has not been acquired for park purposes by December 31, 2024, the \$267,798, plus interest accrued, shall revert back to the AES Cedar Bay Settlement Stipulation Account from which the money was appropriated.

Section 5. Oversight. The Mayor is requested to appoint the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Community Services to insure compliance with the Agreement and all other appropriate laws.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
