5 AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE SETTLEMENT OF 6 POTENTIAL CLAIMS BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF 7 JACKSONVILLE AND VRL ARCHITECTS, INC., M.V. CUMMINGS ENGINEERS, INC., TRANE U.S. INC., D/B/A 8 9 TRANE COMMERCIAL SYSTEMS NORTH FLORIDA AS SET FORTH IN THE FOURTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURT CASE 10 11 NUMBER 16-2019-CA-003913 (THE "LAWSUIT"); 12 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF А PROPOSED SETTLEMENT AND RELEASE AGREEMENT; 13 14 AUTHORIZING THE GENERAL COUNSEL AND HIS 15 DESIGNEE(S) TO TAKE ALL FURTHER ACTION TO RESOLVE THE POTENTIAL CLAIMS; PROVIDING AN 16 EFFECTIVE DATE. 17

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WHEREAS, in or about 2016 and 2017, the City of Jacksonville ("City") replaced the air conditioning/HVAC system at the Animal Care and Protective Services shelter located at 2020 Forest Street, in Jacksonville, Florida ("HVAC Project"); and

23 WHEREAS, VRL ARCHITECTS, INC. ("VRL"), a local architectural 24 firm, entered into a contract with the City to provide architectural 25 and engineering services to the City in connection with the HVAC Project; M.V. CUMMINGS ENGINEERS, INC. ("MVCE"), a local engineering 26 27 firm, entered into a subcontract with VRL to provide the engineering 28 services required of VRL in connection with the HVAC Project; Trane 29 U.S. INC. ("Trane"), a national HVAC equipment manufacturer, entered 30 into a contract with the City to provide the equipment used in the HVAC Project to replace the original HVAC equipment; 31

WHEREAS, shortly after the HVAC system was installed at ACPS, 1 2 the City began experiencing multiple issues associated with excessive 3 air pressure, humidity, and ammonia levels. Over time, many solutions were proposed, and modifications made to the HVAC system, but no 4 proposed solution or modification ever resulted in fully correcting 5 the issues. Eventually, efforts by the contracted parties to resolve 6 7 the outstanding issues ceased. As a result, the City filed suit against VRL, MVCE, and Trane to recover its damages. Because the 8 9 City had not completed payment to Trane for the manufactured equipment, Trane filed a counterclaim against the City, seeking to 10 11 recover that outstanding amount;

12 WHEREAS, VRL, MVCE, and Trane (in varying amounts) have agreed 13 to pay the City a total amount of \$750,000, which will offset the 14 cost of future replacement HVAC units and any necessary remediation 15 efforts caused by the excessive humidity; and

16 WHEREAS, the City, VRL, MVCE, and Trane wish to resolve all 17 matters relating to the Lawsuit, thereby avoiding the risk of 18 increased costs, expenses, and attorney's fees associated with 19 potential litigation; and

20 WHEREAS, the parties have developed a proposed agreement to 21 resolve the potential claims without admitting any liability or fault;

22 Now therefore, **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of 23 Jacksonville:

Section 1. Release of Claims Authorized. Subject to the provisions of Section 2 below, the Office of General Counsel is authorized to release any and all claims against VRL, MVCE, and Trane in accordance with the proposed Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release (attached hereto as "EXHIBIT 1") and is authorized to execute the same.

30 Section 2. Settlement Approved. (a) The proposed Mutual
31 Settlement Agreement and Release attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and

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hereby incorporated by reference in this Ordinance is approved. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute the Agreement, in substantially the form attached, on behalf of the City. In addition, the General Counsel or her designee is authorized to execute all other settlement documents necessary to conclude the approved settlement.

7 Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective 8 upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the 9 Mayor's signature.
