AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$493,863 IN AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT PASS-THROUGH GRANT FUNDING AWARDED BY THE STATE OF FLORIDA, DEPARTMENT OF STATE, DIVISION OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES, FOR THE "REOPEN AND RECONNECT: FILLING THE CONNECTIVITY GAP" PROGRAM, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-037; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY AND THE BOARD OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES; REOUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The funding above represents an appropriation of American

of Florida, Division of Library and Information Services in the amount of \$493,863 for the "Reopen and Reconnect: Filling the Connectivity Gap" program (Project Number 21-ARPA-14) (the "Program"). These federal grant funds are provided through the Library Services and Technology Act under Florida's long-range plan approved by the Institute of Museum and Library Services. The grant period commenced on September 3, 2021 and will conclude on September 30, 2022, by which time all Program tasks must be completed.

Rescue Plan Act pass-through grant funding from the State

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to support the "Reopen and Reconnect: Filling the Connectivity Gap" program for fiscal year 2021-2022. The purpose of the Program is to support the reopening of Duval County's public libraries by mitigating the "connectivity gap" for library customers without reliable internet access or equipment at home and to allow for continued social distancing and minimization of staff contact within library facilities.

The grant funds will be used to purchase sixteen self-check machines for smaller urban footprint branches and to facilitate and promote digital inclusion through accessible Wi-Fi, internet hot spots and digital resources for users in the City's five urban library service areas (Eastside, Graham, Main, Brentwood and Westbrook) and at one branch library heavily focused on adult learners (Webb-Wesconnett). The portion of the Program focused on digital inclusion is expected to serve an estimated 64,810 households in the six aforementioned library service areas. The self-check solutions part of the Program will cover an additional six branches with an estimated 95,771 households (Argyle, Highlands, Maxville, Murray Hill, University Park, and West).
