RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING COUNCIL SECRETARY/DIRECTOR CHERYL L. BROWN FOR HER DECADES OF ASSISTANCE TO THE JACKSONVILLE CITY COUNCIL ON THE OCCASION OF HER RETIREMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Dr. Cheryl Brown, a native of Nichols, Florida, earned her bachelor's degree (magna cum laude) in Sociology and a master's degree (summa cum laude) in Applied Social Sciences from the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University where she was an active member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., served several internships, and taught as an adjunct professor at the university; and

WHEREAS, in June 1990 Dr. Brown was hired by the City Council as a Policy Analyst and in January 1992 was promoted to Chief of Policy Analysis (a title later changed to Chief of the Research Division when the division was renamed in 2000); and

WHEREAS, in June 2001 Cheryl Brown was elevated to the position Council Secretary/Director, a position that combines administrative, management and leadership responsibilities of a department director with the ministerial, archival, legislative, and other duties of a city clerk, along with responsibility for the county's Value Adjustment Board; and

WHEREAS, 21 during her nearly years as Council Secretary/Director, Dr. Brown has successfully undertaken numerous initiatives to keep the City Council on the leading edge of

technological advancements to both better serve the needs of the City's elected officials and to increase transparency and the general public's access to timely and complete information on the activities of the City Council. Those initiatives include the audio and video recording of Council, committee, and noticed member-to-member meetings and making those recordings readily available to the public via indexed on-line links to the City Council web site or via hard media such as CDs and DVDs; the establishment of dedicated email boxes for receiving public input on "hot topics" of the day; the implementation of electronic meeting material distribution and electronic voting via smart devices; the installation of state-ofthe-art computers, broadcast-quality audio-visual technology and lighting in the City Council Chamber; the addition of technology and staff to make possible the live streaming of council members' town hall community meetings, public hearings, and other events to provide the widest possible public access; and many other similar initiatives; and

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WHEREAS, Cheryl Brown was integrally involved, along with the City's Ethics, Compliance and Oversight Office and the Office of General Counsel, in developing, continually presenting, and updating the most comprehensive training program of any local government on ethics, "government in the sunshine", public records, gift disclosure, lobbyist registration and other ethics-related topics; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brown has organized and continually stressed employee orientation and on-going education efforts, particularly the extremely thorough multi-day training given to new council members and their executive assistants immediately after their election as they ready themselves to take office; and

WHEREAS, one of Dr. Brown's signature accomplishments was shepherding the City Council through the COVID-19 pandemic, which

entailed the gargantuan task of rapidly shifting the Council's meetings and administrative functions from in-person to virtual formats in a way that still complied with the state's open meeting requirements, a task for which she was given the President's Award by Council President Tommy Hazouri. Under her leadership the Council implemented robust on-line meeting broadcast and interactive participation technologies (email, Zoom meeting software, etc.) so that the public could continue to observe and fully participate in public meetings of all kinds during the closure of City Hall. She also led the effort to return the Council's meeting rooms and offices to safe public access as the pandemic progressed through the installation of protective shields around work spaces, the ready availability of personal protective equipment and enhanced sanitizing practices, and other policies and procedures that enabled the work of the government to resume in-person while still taking all possible precautions to protect the health and safety of both the general public and the Council's staff and elected officials; and

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WHEREAS, during her tenure with the City Council, Cheryl Brown earned a doctoral degree in Counseling and Leadership Management from World Bible College, was very involved in community organizations, including serving on the boards of Girls, Inc., the AME Academy of Excellence of North Florida, and the Florida Ballet, and was a very active member of the Jerusalem Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star, Heroines Jericho, Golden Circle, Daughters of Isis, and Genesis Court #1, Prince Hall Affiliated.

WHEREAS, Dr. Brown is an effective and inspirational team leader and has been an invaluable resource to the City Council throughout her nearly thirty-two years with the Council staff, and the Council is grateful for her years of service as she retires from public service; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Dr. Cheryl Brown for her more than three decades of outstanding service to the Jacksonville City Council and thanks her for her leadership, innovation, and dedication to continually providing the Council with the tools and the experienced personnel it needs to fulfill its mission of service to our citizens. The Council extends its grateful thanks for her invaluable service and her wise counsel and friendship, and wishes her the very best of health and happiness in her retirement.
