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ORDINANCE 2022-93

AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$156,290 FROM THE GENERAL FUND -GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT FUND BALANCE TO HISTORIC STANTON, INC. TO BE USED FOR BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS AT THE HISTORIC STANTON SCHOOL BUILDING, LOCATED AT 521 WEST ASHLEY STREET; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND HISTORIC STANTON, INC. TO PROVIDE FOR BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS AT THE HISTORIC STANTON SCHOOL BUILDING, LOCATED AT 521 WEST ASHLEY STREET; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH HISTORIC STANTON, INC. TO PROVIDE FOR BUILDING IMPORVEMENTS; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH HISTORIC STANTON, INC.; WAIVING SECTION 118.201(F)(7) (RELEASE APPROPRIATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR ADVANCE PAYMENTS IN EXCESS OF 10% TO HISTORIC STANTON, INC.; PROVIDING OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the historic Stanton School building, known as the Edwin M. Stanton High School, was constructed in 1917 to serve the African American residents of Jacksonville as part of one of the largest school construction programs ever initiated in Duval County; and

WHEREAS, the present building represents the culmination of 150 years of African American education, as well as being closely associated with the life and works of James Weldon Johnson, one of the City's most noted citizens and author of the prominent hymn "Lift Every Voice and Sing"; and

WHEREAS, the property was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1983; and

WHEREAS, the property was designated as a landmark structure by the Council in 2013; and

WHEREAS, in April 2020, the historic Stanton School building's roof collapsed, and then subsequently the property was condemned; and

WHEREAS, Historic Stanton, Inc., desires to save this building from neglect and begin working to preserve the structure's integrity from further deterioration; and

WHEREAS, the renovation and restoration of the historic Stanton School building is consistent with the goals of the Downtown Historic Preservation and Revitalization Task Force Initiatives, which state, among other things, that preserving and restoring the historic architectural fabric of downtown Jacksonville by bringing underutilized or abandoned historic buildings back into use are important to the City's welfare; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found, and declared as follows:

(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

(b) The authorizations provided by this ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county/municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

Section 2. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The appropriation above provides \$156,290 in funding from the General Fund - General Services District Fund Balance derived from unused funds within the Historic Stanton Rehab Contingency for subsidies and contributions within the Office of Grants and Compliance to Historic Stanton, Inc. for building improvements

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide Historic Stanton, Inc. Contingency account to be used for building improvements, specifically repairing a portion of the roof that collapsed, mending minor leaks on subfloors, and boarding up the windows and other compromised entry points at the Historic Stanton school building, located at 521 West Ashley Street. Historic Stanton, Inc. has received estimates for scope of work for potential improvements, as more fully described as Exhibit 2, attached

hereto.

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Section 4. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and Historic Stanton, Inc., in substantially the form as attached hereto as On File and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement") to provide for building improvements at the historic Stanton school building located at 521 West Ashley Street.

Section 5. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the services of Historic Stanton, Inc., to provide for building improvements to the historic Stanton school building, located at 521 West Ashley Street. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. Waiver of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract with Historic Stanton, Inc. and the City of Jacksonville. Historic Stanton, Inc. is a non-profit organization which owns the historic Stanton school building, located at 521 West Ashley Street. The City finds that Historic Stanton, Inc.

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is a justified direct contract because Historic Stanton, Inc. is the only entity that can perform building improvements to aforementioned structure.

Waiver of Section 118.201(f)(7) Section 7. (Release of Appropriations), Ordinance Code. Section 118.201(f)(7) (Release of Appropriations), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived as to the disbursement of funds based upon draws for services performed or reimbursements for work done. Waiver of Section 118.201(f)(7), Ordinance Code, is requested to allow advance payments in excess of 10% to Historic Stanton, Inc.

Oversight Department. The Department of Finance and Administration shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 9. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
