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## ORDINANCE 2022-27-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$249,794.00 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT JUSTICE, OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ORIENTED OF POLICING SERVICES ("COPS"), FOR THE 2021 POLICING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INTERVENTION TEAM PROGRAM (THE "PROGRAM"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-028; PURPOSE APPROPRIATION; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER THAT CERTAIN SUBAWARD AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY JACKSONVILLE AND LUTHERAN SERVICES FLORIDA, INC. FOR COPS COMMUNITY POLICING DEVELOPMENT CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAMS PROGRAM; INVOKING THEEXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107 (G), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH LUTHERAN SERVICES FLORIDA, INC. TO PROVIDE SERVICES AND SUPPORT FOR A CO-RESPONDER (CRISIS INTERVENTION) TEAM; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an appropriation of grant funds from the Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, for the Community Policing Development Crisis Intervention Teams Program (the "Program"). The grant period commenced on September 1, 2021 and continues through August 31, 2023. No local match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for a Co-Responder (Crisis Intervention) Team. This team will consist of a clinician and a sworn law enforcement officer who will work side-by-side to respond to non-violent health-related calls for service, engage in specialized assignments from zone commanders, and who will conduct proactive outreach in the community. The funds will be used to expand and support the Sheriff's Co-Responder Team by offsetting certain travel and training expenses and procuring the professional services of Lutheran Services Florida, Inc. ("LSF").

Pursuant to the agreement described and authorized below, LSF will be responsible to secure one (1) clinician to serve on the Co-Responder Team for two (2) years and will provide training and ongoing support for the Co-Responder Team. The clinician will be a credentialed mental health professional who can provide specialized mental health intervention and crisis de-escalation services. One police officer from the Sheriff's Patrol and Enforcement Division will be re-assigned to the Co-Responder Team to work with the

clinician to carry out the purposes and intent of the Program. A copy of the Grant Award Letter (Federal Grant Award No. 15JCOPS-21-GG-02310-SPPS) and conditions is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Grant").

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Section 3. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, that certain Subaward Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and Lutheran Services Florida, Inc. for COPS Community Policing Development Crisis Intervention Teams Program in a not-to-exceed amount of \$246,044.00, substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**, and incoprorated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and oblgiations of LSF as stated in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of LSF to provide services in support of the Co-Responder Team in accordance with the conditions of the Grant
