A RESOLUTION APPROVING CERTAIN REVISIONS TO THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN, ORIGINALLY ADOPTED BY RESOLUTION 2004-277-A, AS AMENDED IN RESOLUTIONS 2005-710-A, 2006-1018-A, 2009-904-A, 2010-907-A, 2012-465-A AND 2017-709-A, AND REQUIRED BY CHAPTER 252, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND CHAPTER 674, ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

City of Jacksonville Comprehensive Emergency Section 1. Management Plan revisions approved. Pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 674, Ordinance Code, the City Jacksonville/Duval County has developed and maintains a county emergency management plan and program that is coordinated with the State of Florida's emergency management plan and program. emergency management plans are designed to provide guidance and procedures relative to emergency preparedness and management and act as a mechanism that allows for standardization of policies and procedures to facilitate an integrated and coordinated response among local, state, and federal government and non-profit entities to protect against, prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the impacts of a wide variety of disasters.

To ensure compliance with various State requirements and the

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National Incident Management System, the City has incorporated certain revisions and updates to its 2021 Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), a copy of which has been placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services, and which updates and revisions are hereby approved. A summary of the specific changes to the 2021 CEMP are outlined in the Executive Summary attached hereto as **Exhibit** 1 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City's CEMP was originally adopted by Resolution 2004-277-A, and amended in Resolutions 2005-710-A, 2006-1018-A, 2009-904-A, 2010-907-A, 2012-465-A, and 2017-709-A.

Section 2. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
