A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE

AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF FORMER SCHOOL BOARD

MEMBER AND CIVIC LEADER JIMMIE ALPHONSO "TAB"

JOHNSON; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Jimmie Alphonso Johnson, a Jacksonville native, graduated from Stanton Senior High School in 1952 and earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education and leadership at Florida A&M University where he played on the football team and was commissioned in the U.S. Army Reserves after his ROTC service; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson worked briefly for the U.S. Postal Service before beginning a long career as an educator in Northwest Jacksonville, first as a teacher at Moncrief Elementary School and then as a teacher, assistant and head football coach, athletic director, assistant principal and principal over the course of 37 years at Northwestern Junior-Senior High School, Jean Ribault High School, Stanton Vocational High School, New Stanton High School, and William Raines High School, where he served as Principal for 16 years, the school's longest-serving principal; and

WHEREAS, following his retirement from coaching and school leadership, Coach Johnson continued his public service by winning a seat on the Duval County School Board and being re-elected to a second term, and serving as the Chair of the School Board in 2001; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his service in the school system, Jimmie Johnson was a Director of the Florida High School Athletic Association, President of the Gateway Athletic Conference, served on the boards of directors of Communities in Schools and Learn to Read,

served his lifetime church, St. Paul A.M.E., as a board trustee and Sunday School Superintendent, and was one of the original founders of the Bob Hayes Track Meet, the largest track and field meet for high school students in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Coach Johnson often said that his life was shaped by the influence of his own coaches, including the late Chappie James, Edwin Lawson, James Smalls, Theodore Montgomery, Jake Gaither and Pete Griffin and role models, William Weathersbee, Dr. Alvin White and Earl Kitchings. The lessons he learned from these giants translated into guiding principles in his life and later with his own students. It was his love for football and mentoring young men that propelled his career into life as an educator who positively influenced the lives of tens of thousands of students over a long and distinguished career in the Duval public schools; and

WHEREAS, the City Council was saddened to learn of the recent passing of this outstanding leader and community servant, who was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Thelma Whitted Johnson; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates the life and countless achievements of Jimmie Alphonso "Tab" Johnson and extends to his family, friends, and countless admirers the City's sincere condolences upon his passing. Coach Johnson was an extraordinary leader and mentor and his service to our community in many capacities will be long and gratefully remembered.
