## ORDINANCE 2022-172

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 150 AN (ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE), PART 2 (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 150.224 (PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AMEND THE PROCESS FOR ISSUANCE OF A PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD FOR ALL PERFORMERS IN ADULT ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENTS; AMENDING 151 (DANCING CHAPTER ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENT CODE), PART 2 (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 151.214 (PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AMEND THE PROCESS FOR ISSUANCE OF A PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD FOR ALL PERFORMERS IN DANCING ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 Section 1. Intent and severability. The intent of this 22 legislation is to enact a scheme of uniform and non-discriminatory 23 and manner regulations for performers at time, place adult 24 entertainment establishments and dancing entertainment establishments 25 in the City. It is the Council's intent that these regulations be interpreted and applied to not eliminate all forms of adult 26 27 entertainment, but instead, to be narrowly tailored and limited to assist in reducing criminal activities occurring at these facilities. 28 29 The provisions of this Ordinance are intended to be severable, and 30 if any provision is declared invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be severed and the 31

remainder shall continue in full force and effect with the Ordinance 1 2 being deemed amended to the least degree legally permissible. 3 Section 2. Amending Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 150.224 (Performer 4 5 work identification card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 6 7 150.224 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows: 8 9 CHAPTER 150. ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE. 10 PART 2. ADMINISTRATION 11 + \* + 12 Sec. 150.224. Performer work identification card. 13 Performer Work Identification Card required. Any person 14 (a) 15 desiring to perform in an adult entertainment establishment licensed under this Chapter must obtain a Work Identification Card from the 16 17 Sheriff. No person shall act as a performer in an adult entertainment 18 establishment without having previously obtained said Work Identification Card, except as permitted during the Grace Period as 19 20 set forth in this section. Additionally, no license holder or 21 establishment manager shall employ, contract with or otherwise allow 22 any performer to perform in an adult entertainment establishment who 23 does not possess a valid and effective Work Identification Card except 24 as permitted during the Grace Period as set forth in this section. 25 Establishment managers shall be required to review all Performer 26 Rosters at the commencement of his or her shift to verify compliance 27 with this section. 28 Violations of this section shall be a civil (b) Penalty. 29 infraction. Any performer, license holder, owner, operator or manager 30 who violates or knowingly permits a violation of this section shall

be\_assessed a civil penalty of \$200 guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree.

3 (C) Application for Work Identification Card. An application for a Work Identification Card shall be <del>created by and</del> obtained from 4 5 the Sheriff. The Sheriff is authorized to include whatever information 6 he or she deems relevant to the purposes established in this section 7 for issuance of the Work Identification Card, including The 8 application shall include: the applicant's full legal name (including 9 maiden name, if applicable); residential address; driver's license 10 number or government issued identification or passport number; date of birth; natural hair and eye color; race; sex; height and weight; 11 12 place of birth (city, state or country); telephone number; email address; a list of locations of and descriptions of any tattoos; 13 confirmation that the applicant has not been convicted within the 14 15 relevant periods of time of any violation listed in subparagraph (1), and a list of each adult entertainment establishment where the 16 17 applicant will be performing and each stage name used by the applicant 18 at each locationfingerprinting and photographs and proof of a valid 19 and effective work permit or visa for non-U.S. citizens. Each 20 applicant shall demonstrate affirm through either attestation on the 21 application or presentation of a certificate of completion to the 22 Sheriff that he or she has completed aone, free-of-charge, sex 23 trafficking education program. Acceptable training programs include 24 those developed and presented by the American Hotel & Lodging 25 Association, the Polaris Project 26 (https://polarisproject.org/training/) (approximately 45 min. in 27 length), ECPAT-USA, Business Ending Slavery & Trafficking and or the 28 U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Blue Campaign Consequences 29 Training (https://www.dhs.gov/bluecampaign/course consequences p01) (approximately 15 min. in length). 30 31 The Sheriff shall maintain and make available to any applicant each

1 sex trafficking education program in the event any applicant does not 2 have online access to the program(s). Additionally, the applicant 3 shall affirm that he or she understands that the Work Identification Card may be immediately revoked if issuance of the card is made 4 5 illegal through order of any court. Other programs not listed may be approved by the Sheriff. The application shall be in writing, 6 7 signed and notarized, fully completed and submitted to the Sheriff together with the nonrefundable application fee. Each applicant must 8 9 submit proof of identity at the time the application is submitted. 10 and proof that applicant is at least twenty-one (21) years of age. 11 Work Identification Cards shall not be issued to any person under the age of twenty one. Additionally, nNo Work Identification Card shall 12 be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of human trafficking 13 or any human trafficking-related charge or who is currently on 14 15 probationsuspension for any violation listed under subsection (1), Work Identification Cards are valid for a term of one (1) 16 below. 17 year. Applicants are required to update his or her application with changes to any of the application information (except height and 18 weight) within 60 days of the change of such information. All current 19 20 performers shall obtain complete and submit an application for a Work 21 Identification Card within ninety (90) days from the effective date 22 of this section (the "Grace Period"). Upon conclusion of the Grace 23 Period, no performer shall be permitted to perform until a current 24 Work Identification Card is obtained or without a valid copy of the 25 application fee payment check or receipt as specified in subparagraph 26 (e), below.

(d) False statement or false information in applying for a Work *Identification Card*. It shall be unlawful for any person applying for
a Work Identification Card to make a false statement or otherwise
provide false information which is intended to facilitate the issuance
of same. In addition to any other penalties provided herein, the

Sheriff is authorized to petition the court for immediate revocation
 of any Worker Identification Card that has been determined by the
 Sheriff to have been issued based on fraudulent or false information.

Fees. The applicant shall pay an application fee with each 4 (e) 5 new request for a Work Identification Card and with each renewal of a Work Identification Card. The fees shall not be prorated. The 6 7 applicant shall also pay a duplicate card fee for each duplicate copy 8 of an existing Work Identification Card. The initial fee for an 9 initial Work Identification Card shall be \$100. The initial fee for 10 a renewal card shall be \$50. The initial fee for a duplicate 11 replacement card shall be \$35. The Sheriff shall be entitled to 12 impose a three percent (3%) annual increase of the fees. A copy of 13 the check, or of a receipt issued by the Sheriff, showing payment for an application or duplicate card shall operate as a receipt for said 14 15 fees and shall allow the applicant to perform pending receipt of the official Work Identification Card. The initial and renewal 16 17 application fee shall be \$150. The fee for issuance of a duplicate Work Identification Card shall be \$50. Fees are non-refundable. 18

Issuance of Work Identification Card. The Sheriff is 19 (f) 20 responsible for verifying all information contained on a Work 21 Identification Card application. The Sheriff shall approve or deny 22 an application within fourteen (14) days of receipt of a completed 23 application and payment of the applicable fee. If the Sheriff fails 24 to approve or deny an application within the 14-day time limit, the 25 application shall be deemed granted and the applicant can continue 26 to rely on his or her receipt or check copy as a substitute for the 27 Work Identification Card to legally perform or can request the Sheriff to issue an official card. Upon determining that the Work 28 Identification Card should be issued, the Sheriff shall immediately 29 30 render a Work Identification Card to the applicant. SaidAn issued Work Identification Card shall, at a minimum, include the performer's 31

1 name, photograph, date of birth, height, weight, natural eye and hair 2 color, and a unique card number. Should the Sheriff determine that 3 the proof submitted with the application for the Work Identification Card as required hereinabove is not satisfactory or full payment of 4 5 the application fee is not received, the Sheriff shall deny issuance of said Work Identification Card and shall provide written 6 7 notification to the applicant stating the reason(s) for any such 8 denial.

9 (q) Retention of Performer Roster and Work Identification Card. All persons required pursuant to this Code to obtain a Work 10 11 Identification Card shall keep same on their person or with their personal belongings at all times while performing at an adult 12 entertainment establishment. The adult entertainment establishment 13 shall compile and retain a complete performer roster that includes 14 15 all performers performing at the establishment for a period of thirty (30) days from each performer's most recent performance date. The 16 performer roster shall be organized by date and performer, including 17 the performer's first and last name and stage name. The adult 18 entertainment establishment shall also maintain a Work Identification 19 20 Card file, organized alphabetically by performer's last name, with 21 legible photocopies of the Work Identification Card of each performer 22 performing at said establishment for a period of two (2) years from 23 each performer's most recent performance date. Other than performers 24 performing during the Grace Period established in this section, no 25 performer shall perform until the performer roster is updated to 26 include the performer information, and the legible photocopy of the 27 Work Identification Card is placed on file as required herein. The performer roster and the Work Identification Card file shall be made 28 29 available to the Sheriff for inspection and/or copying upon request, which shall only be made during normal business hours when the 30 establishment is open to the public. 31

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1 (h) Appeal. In the event that an applicant for a Work 2 Identification Card is denied, said applicant may request emergency injunctive relief from the Circuit Court of the Fourth Judicial 3 Circuit of the State of Florida. Due to the overriding public interest 4 5 in not having persons under the age of twenty-one or with criminal convictions identified 6 in paragraph (1) perform in adult 7 entertainment establishments, no provisional Work Identification Cards shall be issued by the Sheriff. 8

9 (i) Transfer of Work Identification Card prohibited. A Work 10 Identification Card shall not be transferred from one person to 11 another; however, the person to whom the Work Identification Card was 12 issued may utilize same in any and all-licensed adult entertainment 13 establishments in the Cityidentified in the Work Identification Card 14 application.

(j) Alteration of Work Identification Card prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to alter or otherwise change the contents of a Work Identification Card without the written permission of the Sheriff.

Requirement of Managers, License Holders, Owners and 19 (k) 20 Operators to Verify Work Identification Cards of Performers. No person 21 managing, owning or operating or holding a license to operate an 22 adult entertainment establishment shall permit, employ, or otherwise 23 allow any person to perform at said establishment unless such person 24 has a valid, current, Work Identification Card issued in accordance 25 herewith, unless such performer is performing within the Grace Period 26 established in this section. Each owner and operator of the 27 establishment shall have a separate and independent duty to verify 28 that all performers are in compliance with this section. Each manager 29 of the establishment shall have a separate and independent duty to verify that all performers are in compliance with this section during 30 all times the manager is working at the establishment. 31 Separate

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violations may be issued to the managers, owners and operators of the establishment for each performer, and for each day that a performer does not have the required Work Identification Card. It shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this Chapter if the establishment does not have a legible photocopy of a current Work Identification Card on file for each performer as of the date of each performance, except during the Grace Period.

Violations that are subject to criminal prosecution; 8 (1) 9 suspension. Either while performing at or while present in any adult 10 entertainment establishment, any performer who violates this section 11 may be prosecuted by the State Attorney. Upon conviction of such violation, the prosecuting officials shall notify the Sheriff of said 12 13 conviction. Additionally, fFor any performer convicted of the following violations either while performing at or while present in 14 15 any adult entertainment establishment, the performer's Work Identification Card shall be suspended as follows: 16

17 i. Five (5) years for prostitution;

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18 ii. Three (3) years for violent forcible felonies;

- 19 iii. Three (3) years for narcotic sales or drug trafficking;
  - iv. One (1) year for lewd/obscene acts; and
    - v. One (1) year for possession of narcotics or narcotics paraphernalia.

23 The suspensions authorized herein shall not be ordered as part of any 24 criminal penalties assessed in any criminal proceeding. It is the 25 Council's intent that the remedies established herein are civil in 26 nature and are not intended to be a criminal penalty in contravention 27 of those established in the Florida Statutes. The Sheriff is authorized to petition the court for immediate suspension of any 28 29 Worker Identification Card as authorized herein.

30 (m) Violation Subject to Civil Prosecution. Any owners,
 31 managers or operators of an adult entertainment establishment who

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violates the provisions of subsections (g), (k) or (l) of this section may be prosecuted by the Sheriff or the City. Upon adjudication of such civil violation, the prosecuting officials shall notify the Sheriff of such adjudication within five (5) business days. Violations shall be considered a Class F civil offenseasses a fine of \$200, with each day upon which a violation occurs constituting a separate civil offense.

(n) Violations Subject to All-Legal Remedies. The violation of 8 9 any provision of this section may be prosecuted pursuant to the civil 10 procedures and penalties of Chapter 609, Ordinance Code, or through 11 the issuance of notices to appear, at the discretion of the Sheriff or the City. Additionally, the City shall be authorized to take any 12 13 appropriate legal action, including, but not limited to, seeking cease and desist orders, and requesting temporary or permanent 14 15 injunctive relief. It is the intent and purpose of this section to provide additional and cumulative remedies. 16

Section 3. Amending Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment Establishment Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment Establishment Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The performer roster shall be organized by date and performer, including 30 the performer's first and last name and stage name. The dancing 31

entertainment establishment shall also maintain a Work Identification 1 Card file, organized alphabetically by performer's last name, with 2 3 legible photocopies of the Work Identification Card of each performer performing at said establishment for a period of two (2) years from 4 5 each performer's most recent performance date. Other than performers performing during the Grace Period established in this section, no 6 7 performer shall perform until the performer roster is updated to include the performer information, and the legible photocopy of the 8 9 Work Identification Card is placed on file as required herein. The 10 performer roster and the Work Identification Card file shall be made available to the Sheriff for inspection and/or copying upon request, 11 12 which shall only be made during normal business hours when the 13 establishment is open to the public.

Appeal. In the event that an applicant for a 14 (h) Work 15 Identification Card is denied, said applicant may request emergency injunctive relief from the Circuit Court of the Fourth Judicial 16 17 Circuit of the State of Florida. Due to the overriding public interest in not having persons under the age of twenty-one or with criminal 18 19 convictions identified in paragraph (1) perform in adult 20 entertainment establishments, no provisional Work Identification 21 Cards shall be issued by the Sheriff.

(i) Transfer of Work Identification Card prohibited. A Work
Identification Card shall not be transferred from one person to
another; however, the person to whom the Work Identification Card was
issued may utilize same in any and all licensed dancing entertainment
establishments in the Cityidentified in the Work Identification Card
application.

(j) Alteration of Work Identification Card prohibited. It shall
be unlawful for any person to alter or otherwise change the contents
of a Work Identification Card without the written permission of the
Sheriff.

1 (k) Requirement of Managers, License Holders, Owners and 2 Operators to Verify Work Identification Cards of Performers. No person 3 managing, owning or operating or holding a license to operate a dancing entertainment establishment shall permit, 4 employ, or 5 otherwise allow any person to perform at said establishment unless such person has a valid, current, Work Identification Card issued in 6 7 accordance herewith, unless such performer is performing within the Grace Period established in this section. Each owner and operator of 8 9 the establishment shall have a separate and independent duty to verify 10 that all performers are in compliance with this section. Each manager 11 of the establishment shall have a separate and independent duty to 12 verify that all performers are in compliance with this section during 13 all times the manager is working at the establishment. Separate violations may be issued to the managers, owners and operators of the 14 15 establishment for each performer, and for each day that a performer does not have the required Work Identification Card. It shall be 16 17 prima facie evidence of a violation of this Chapter if the establishment does not have a legible photocopy of a current Work 18 Identification Card on file for each performer as of the date of each 19 20 performance, except during the Grace Period.

21 Violations that are subject to criminal prosecution; (1) 22 suspension. Either while performing at or while present in any dancing 23 entertainment establishment, any performer who violates subsection 24 (a) of this section may be prosecuted by the State Attorney. Upon 25 conviction of such violation, the prosecuting officials shall notify 26 the Sheriff of said conviction. Additionally, fFor any performer 27 convicted of the following violations either while performing at or 28 while present in any dancing entertainment establishment, the 29 performer's Work Identification Card shall be suspended as follows:

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- i. Five (5) years for prostitution;
- ii. Three (3) years for violent forcible felonies;

iii. Three (3) years for narcotic sales or drug trafficking;
 iv. One (1) year for lewd/obscene acts; and
 v. One (1) year for possession of narcotics or narcotics

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paraphernalia.

5 The suspensions authorized herein shall not be ordered as part of any 6 criminal penalties assessed in any criminal proceeding. It is the 7 Council's intent that the remedies established herein are civil in 8 nature and are not intended to be a criminal penalty in contravention 9 of those established in the Florida Statutes. <u>The Sheriff is</u> 10 <u>authorized to petition the court for immediate suspension of any</u> 11 <u>Worker Identification Card as authorized herein.</u>

12 Violation Subject to Civil Prosecution. Any owners, (m) 13 managers or operators of a dancing entertainment establishment who violates the provisions of subsections (g), (k) or (l) of this section 14 15 may be prosecuted by the Sheriff or the City. Upon adjudication of such civil violation, the prosecuting officials shall notify the 16 17 Sheriff of such adjudication within five (5) business days. Violations shall be considered a Class F civil offenseassessed a fine 18 of \$200, with each day upon which a violation occurs constituting a 19 separate civil offense. 20

21 Violations Subject to All-Legal Remedies. The violation of (n) 22 any provision of this section may be prosecuted pursuant to the civil 23 procedures and penalties of Chapter 609, Ordinance Code or through 24 the issuance of notices to appear, at the discretion of the City or the Sheriff. Additionally, the City shall be authorized to take any 25 26 appropriate legal action, including, but not limited to, seeking 27 cease and desist orders, and requesting temporary or permanent 28 injunctive relief. It is the intent and purpose of this section to 29 provide additional and cumulative remedies.

30 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become 31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
