A RESOLUTION DENYING THE APPEAL OF A FINAL ORDER THE JACKSONVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS COA-21-26335, AS REQUESTED BY NEULJAN KORE, TO DEMOLISH A CONTRIBUTING STRUCTURE AT 1323 IONIA STREET, IN THE SPRINGFIELD HISTORIC DISTRICT (R.E. NO. 072500-0010) IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 7, PURSUANT TO 307 CHAPTER (HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROTECTION), PART 2 (APPELLATE PROCEDURE), ORDINANCE CODE; ADOPTING RECOMMENDED FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THE LAND USE AND ZONING COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Neuljan Kore, the owner of property at 1323 Ionia Street, in the Springfield Historic District, in Council District 7, submitted Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335, requesting to demolish a contributing structure; and

WHEREAS, by Final Order dated November 12, 2021, Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission approved Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335, requesting to demolish a contributing structure; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2021, pursuant to Section 307.201, Ordinance Code, Preservation SOS, Inc. filed a Notice of Appeal, appealing the Final Order approving Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335; and

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WHEREAS, the Notice of Appeal was timely filed and the appellant has standing to appeal; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the language in Council Rule 2.102(a)(5) which provides that the Rules Committee shall consider all resolutions, this appeal is a quasi-judicial matter that is heard only by the Land Use and Zoning Committee as the committee of reference to the City Council for such matters pursuant to the procedures outlined in Section 307.204, Ordinance Code; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Adoption of recommended findings conclusions. The Council has reviewed the record of proceedings for the Appeal of the Final Order approving Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335. The record of proceedings is On File with the City Council Legislative Services Division and the Planning and Development Department. After reviewing the record of proceedings, the recommended findings and conclusions of the Land Use and Zoning Committee are hereby adopted by the Council. This Resolution is the final action of the Council. Based on the competent, substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, including the Planning and Development Department Staff Report, the Appeal is denied, the Historic Preservation Commission Final Order approving Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335 is upheld, and Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335 is **approved**. Pursuant to Section 166.033(3), Florida Statutes, the Council hereby finds:

(1) This Resolution shall serve as written notice to the appellant, Preservation SOS, Inc., and the applicant for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335, Neuljan Kore.

Based on a review and application of the criteria listed 1 in Section 307.106, Ordinance Code, pertaining to demolition requests and the competent, substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, Certificate of Application for Appropriateness COA-21-26335 sufficiently demonstrates a basis for granting the request for demolition of the subject contributing structure located in the 6 Springfield Historic District.

Section 2. Notice. Legislative Services is hereby directed to mail a copy of this Resolution, as adopted, to the appellant, the applicant for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-21-26335, and any other parties who testified before the Land Use and Zoning Committee, or who otherwise filed a qualifying written statement as defined in Section 307.202(c), Ordinance Code.

Effective Date. The adoption of this Resolution Section 3. shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of the City Council and shall become effective upon the signature by the Council President and Council Secretary.
