A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF RENOWNED RIBAULT HIGH SCHOOL BAND DIRECTOR CLIFFORD M. BUGGS, SR.; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Clifford Buggs, Sr., a Jacksonville native, graduated from Old Stanton High School in 1955 and from Florida A&M University with a degree in music in 1959; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Buggs joined the U.S. Army and played in the Army Band for several years before taking a job, recommended to him by Kernaa McFarlin, his band director at Stanton, as band director at a school in Waycross, Georgia in 1962. When he retired as the band director at Stanton in 1967, Mr. McFarlin selected Mr. Buggs to return to his alma mater and take over the band; and

WHEREAS, Clifford Buggs took over the Stanton Band in the midst of the school desegregation movement in Jacksonville, and the opening of new schools and the redistricting of students from one school to another made continuity in bands difficult, but the Stanton band survived and thrived under Mr. Buggs' leadership. In 1972 he moved to Ribault High School as the band director where he led the Trojans Marching Band for the next 34 years with great distinction until his retirement in 2006; and

WHEREAS, during his more than four decades as a band director, Mr. Buggs influenced thousands of young people through his high standards for musicianship, academics and behavior, imparting old1 2

school values that have stood the test of time and helped his students become successful, creative, productive citizens and leaders; and

WHEREAS, in 2004 Clifford Buggs was recognized for his decades of outstanding work and mentorship by the University of North Florida by being named a recipient of the university's Gladys Prior Award for Career Teaching Excellence, a well-deserved honor; and

WHEREAS, the City Council was saddened to learn of the recent passing of Mr. Buggs, who contributed so much to Jacksonville's young people. Mr. Buggs is survived by his wife, Mrs. Miriam Buggs, his daughter, Ms. Lena Buggs, his son, Mr. Terrance Buggs, grandchildren, his family and friends and many devoted former students; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of Clifford M. Buggs, Sr., the renowned director of the Ribault High School Trojans Marching Band, for his decades of service to the Duval County Public Schools and to the students who benefitted so greatly from his influence. The City extends sincere condolences to Mr. Buggs' family, friends, and many admirers.
