6 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 7 Section 1 is to transfer \$161,918.00 from Mosquito Control State Subfund 00112 fund balance to cover operational expenses for the 8 9 Mosquito Control Division during FY 2021-2022 including, but not 10 limited to, the purchase of spray equipment, an Aft Tail Rotor Driveshaft (MD500E), Administration vehicle replacement, control 11 products, and replacement of security fencing at the 12-acre facility 12 located at 1321 Eastport Road. In addition, these funds will be used 13 14 to leverage a current, time-limited reimbursement grant from the Florida Department of Health to assist the Mosquito Control Division 15 with upgrading local capability to counteract tropical storm-induced 16 17 mosquito infestations and mosquito-borne virus outbreaks.
