AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$36,000.00 IN FUND BALANCE FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FUND (THE "FUND") TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR NATURAL RESOURCE EDUCATION OUTREACH ACTIVITIES HOSTED BY THE DUVAL SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-055; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING CARRYOVER OF FUNDS THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION BOARD AND THE DUVAL SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT; WAIVING SECTION 110.112 (ADVANCE OF CITY FUNDS; PROHIBITION AGAINST), PART 1 (THE TREASURY), CHAPTER 110 (CITY TREASURY), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A PARTIAL ADVANCE PAYMENT BY THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT; REQUIRING ANNUAL REPORTING TO THE JACKSONVILLE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION BOARD; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$36,000.00 from the Environmental Protection Trust Fund (the "Fund") fund balance to support the expansion of natural resources education programming to students ranging from kindergarten through 12th grade.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to support expansion of natural resources education activities and events hosted by the Duval Soil and Water Conservation District (the "District"). These activities are designed to enhance awareness and promote the conservation of natural resources and will specifically target students, beginning farmers, and underserved populations residing in the urban core through activities such as the Envirothon, Start Farming Workshops, Regeneration Park Workshops, and various contests. The Jacksonville Environmental Protection Board approved this expenditure during its meeting on January 18, 2022, as reflected in the Monthly Meeting Summary attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover through September 30, 2025.

Agreement Approved and Execution Authorized. Section 4. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver,

Environmental Protection Board and the District, in substantially the same form as attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). The Agreement may include any respective extension or amendments thereto as necessary and appropriate to effectuate the intent of this ordinance; provided, however, no modifications to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of the District as stated in the Agreement.

Section 5. Waiving Section 110.112, Ordinance Code.

Section 110.112 (Advance of City funds; prohibition against), Part 1

(The City Treasury), Chapter 110 (City Treasury), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived to allow for a partial advance payment to the Duval Soils and Water Conservation District as provided in the Agreement.

Section 6. Oversight. The Environmental Quality Division of the Neighborhoods Department shall provide oversight of the project described herein.

Section 7. Annual Reports. The District is required to provide an annual report to the Jacksonville Environmental Protection Board by September 15th of each year for the duration of the Agreement.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
