AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING NORMANDY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("NORMANDY CDD"), INCLUDING THE GRANT OF SPECIAL POWERS; DESCRIBING THE EXTERNAL BOUNDARIES OF NORMANDY CDD; NAMING NORMANDY CDD; NAMING THE INITIAL NORMANDY CDD BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; AMENDING CHAPTER 92 (UNIFORM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS), ORDINANCE CODE, 92.22 SECTION (EXISTING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS) TO INCLUDE NORMANDY CDD; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT AND SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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17 WHEREAS, Hawk Normandy, LLC ("Petitioner"), a Delaware limited liability company authorized to do business in the State of Florida, 18 petitioned the City Council to establish a community development 19 district named Normandy Community Development District ("Normandy 20 CDD") on approximately 641.48 acres lying wholly within the boundaries 21 22 of the City pursuant to Section 190.005(2), F.S., and Chapter 92, 23 Ordinance Code, a copy of the Amended Petition to Establish Normandy 24 Community Development District ("Petition") is on file with the 25 Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, the land area to be served by Normandy CDD consists of three separate parcels totaling approximately 641.48 acres: CDD Parcel West containing approximately 222.97 acres, CDD Parcel East 3 containing approximately 90.08 acres, and CDD Parcel East containing approximately 328.43 acres, all lying wholly within the boundaries of the City; and WHEREAS, as required by Section 92.07, Ordinance Code, the Office of General Counsel reviewed the Petition and finding it sufficient and complete to permit the fair and informed consideration of the matter by the Council prepared and submitted its Final Report of Counsel, attached hereto as Exhibit 1; and

6 WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department provided its 7 report and recommendation regarding the Petition to the 8 Transportation, Energy and Utilities Committee; and

9 WHEREAS, Petitioner acknowledges that the adoption of this 10 Ordinance shall not in any way waive any of the City's, or any other 11 governing or regulatory entities' rights to grant or not grant 12 entitlements for the development to be serviced by Normandy CDD (the 13 "Development"), or otherwise prejudice the City's, or any other 14 governing or regulatory entities', ability to govern or regulate the 15 planning or permitting of the Development; and

WHEREAS, the Petition adequately meets the requirements of Section 190.005, F.S. and Section 92.04, Ordinance Code and is therefore complete and sufficient to permit fair and informed review thereof; and

20 WHEREAS, all notice requirements of Chapter 190, F.S., Section 21 92.11, Ordinance Code, and other applicable laws were complied with, 22 complete notice was timely given, and a public hearing held on the 23 date and time noticed and conducted thereafter in compliance with 24 Chapter 190, F.S. and all applicable laws; and

WHEREAS, in making its fair and informed determination whether to grant or deny the Petition, the Council has considered the Petition in light of the record developed at the public hearing and in relation to the six factors set forth in Section 190.005(1)(e), F.S., now, therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: **Section 1. Name.** A community development district is

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hereby established within the City to be known hereafter as Normandy
Community Development District.

3 Section 2. The boundaries of Boundaries. Normandy Community Development District established by this Ordinance are as 4 set forth in the legal descriptions contained in the Amended Petition 5 to Establish Normandy Community Development District ("Petition") 6 7 which is **on file** with the Legislative Services Division. The legal 8 descriptions and boundary sketches found within the Petition are 9 attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

10 Section 3. Board of Supervisors. The following five 11 persons, as set forth in the Petition, are designated to be the 12 initial members of the governing Board of Supervisors ("Board") of 13 Normandy Community Development District:

- 14 a. Doug Draper
- 15 b. Lori Price
- 16 c. Ted Sanders
- 17 d. Christie Ray
- 18 e. Michael Lawson

Grant of Special Powers. Consent is hereby Section 4. 19 granted to Normandy Community Development District, pursuant to 20 21 Sections 190.012(2)(a) and(d), F.S., to exercise the power to plan, 22 establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate and maintain additional systems and facilities for 23 24 parks and facilities for indoor and outdoor recreational, cultural, and educational uses and security, all to be exercised only in 25 26 compliance and consistent with all applicable laws, including the City's 2030 Comprehensive Plan and the City's land development 27 28 regulations.

Section 5. Amending Chapter 92 (Uniform Community
Development Districts), Section 92.22 (Existing Community Development
Districts), Ordinance Code. Section 92.22, Ordinance Code, is hereby

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amended to read as follows: 1

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CHAPTER 92 - UNIFORM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS

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3 Sec. 92.22. - Existing Community Development Districts. 4 The following CDDs have been established in the City: 5 (1) Bainebridge Community Development District. The Bainebridge 6 7 Community Development District was established in Ordinance 2005-1417-E. The City granted consent to the 8 Bainebridge Community Development District to exercise 9 special powers related to parks and facilities for indoor 10 11 and outdoor recreational, cultural, and educational uses in Ordinance 2006-592-E. 12 * * * 13 (22) Normandy Community Development District. The Normandy 14 15 Community Development District was established in Ordinance 2022-117-E and was granted consent to exercise 16 17 special powers to plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate and maintain 18 additional systems and facilities for parks and facilities 19 20 for indoor and outdoor recreational, cultural, and educational uses and security. 21

22 Section 6. Conflict and Severability. Any portion of this 23 Ordinance determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be in conflict with prevailing law shall not be effective to the extent of 24 such conflict and shall be deemed severable and the remainder shall 25 continue in full force and effect to the extent legally possible. 26

27 Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming law without 28 29 the Mayor's signature.
