ORDINANCE 2022-188-E

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF MATTHEW LASCELL AS THE INSPECTOR GENERAL, PURSUANT TO SECTION 602.304, ORDINANCE CODE, FOR A TERM OF FOUR (4) YEARS BEGINNING MARCH 21, 2022 AND EXPIRING MARCH 20, 2026; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND MATTHEW LASCELL FOR A FOUR (4) YEAR PERIOD EXPIRING MARCH 20, 2026; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 602, Part 3, Ordinance Code, established the Office of Inspector General and a process for selection of the Inspector General; and

WHEREAS, the responsibility for selecting the Inspector General is vested with the Inspector General Selection and Retention Committee, subject to confirmation by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Inspector General Selection and Retention Committee, at its meeting on February 28, 2022, unanimously voted on the selection of the Inspector General, a copy of the meeting minutes are attached hereto as Exhibit 1; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Confirmation. The Council hereby confirms the appointment of Matthew Lascell as the Inspector General pursuant to Section 602.305, Ordinance Code, for a term of four (4) years beginning March 21, 2022 and expiring on March 20, 2026. A copy of

Mr. Lascell's curricula vitae is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 2. Approval and Authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver a contract between the City of Jacksonville and Matthew Lascell in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference, for a four (4) year period expiring March 20, 2026.

Section 3. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the Inspector General Selection and Retention Committee made its recommendation on February 28, 2022, and the Interim Inspector General's continued availability to fill the Inspector General position is limited. The Council would like to complete the appointment of the new Inspector General while the Interim Inspector General is still available to ensure a smooth and seamless transition as possible.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
