7 A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND SUPPORTING
8 RESOLUTION 2022-01, AS ADOPTED BY THE
9 JACKSONVILLE WATERWAYS COMMISSION, REQUESTING
10 THAT THE CITY PETITION THE UNITED STATES ARMY
11 CORPS OF ENGINEERS ("USACE") TO UNDERTAKE A
12 STUDY TO DETERMINE THE CAUSE AND SOLUTION FOR A
13 SANDBAR/SHOAL FORMED IN THE ST. JOHNS RIVER,
14 ADJACENT TO THE FULTON CUT AND BLOUNT ISLAND;
15 REQUESTING THE MAYOR EXECUTE AND DELIVER A
16 WRITTEN LETTER TO THE USACE FOR THE PURPOSES SET
17 FORTH HEREIN; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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19 **WHEREAS**, in the natural section of the St. Johns River that is
20 adjacent to the "Fulton Cut" and Blount Island, a sandbar or shoal
21 ("shoal") has developed; and

22 **WHEREAS**, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission is committed to
23 the protection of Jacksonville waterways and the citizens of
24 Jacksonville; and

25 **WHEREAS**, the shoal was not present ten (10) years ago, but has
26 formed and is rapidly increasing in size and now encompasses
27 approximately 7 to 10 football fields in length and about 1 football
28 field in width; and

29 **WHEREAS**, at low tide, the depth of the water is only 1.5 to 2
30 feet and presents a great safety risk to people and watercraft; and

31 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to discussions with the USACE staff, in order

1 to obtain assistance from the USACE with this matter, the City is
2 required to make a written request, via the Mayor of the City of
3 Jacksonville or designee, to the USACE to determine if the USACE has
4 the authority or jurisdiction to conduct a study to determine the
5 cause of the formation of the shoal and to plan a strategy for its
6 removal and prevention of future formation; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the USACE staff has advised that a study of similar
8 magnitude would cost approximately \$3,000,000, and the USACE would
9 be expecting the City to sponsor the study and provide \$1,500,000 of
10 that cost; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission, at its regularly
12 scheduled meeting on February 9, 2022 passed a Resolution, attached
13 hereto as **Exhibit 1**, stating its support for the City to request the
14 USACE to undertake the study as outlined; now therefore

15 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

16 **Section 1. Requesting the Mayor Execute and forward a**
17 **written request to the USACE regarding a shoal in the St. Johns River.**

18 The Mayor, or his designee, is hereby requested to execute and
19 deliver, for and on behalf of the City, a written request to the
20 USACE regarding the shoaling that has taken place in the St. Johns
21 River adjacent to the Fulton Cut and Blount Island. The written
22 request, which will be drafted by the Office of General Counsel, will
23 set forth the following: (1) identify the location of the shoal; (2)
24 provide a timeline or history of its creation and request that the
25 USACE proceed to determine if they have jurisdiction over this type
26 of issue; (3) ask the USACE for authority to conduct a study regarding
27 the cause and the solution for removal and prevention of future
28 shoaling in that location; and (4) acknowledge that the City will be
29 a financial partner with the USACE in that study.

30 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

1 without the Mayor's signature.
