RESOLUTION 2022-175-A

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MARCH 25, 2022 AS GREEK INDEPENDENCE DAY AND THE CELEBRATION OF THE GREEK REVOLUTION OF 1821; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Ottoman Empire colonized and occupied Greece for over 400 years. In 1814, a secret organization called Filiki Eteria (Society of Friends) was founded with the aim of liberating Greece. 201 years ago, inspired by the same ideals of liberty, selfgovernance, and passionate belief in democracy that sparked the American Revolution, the people of Greece declared independence. After a nine-year war, Greece gained its independence in 1830; and

WHEREAS, Greek Independence Day falls on March 25th and has been celebrated annually since the end of the Greek Revolution. It is also known as the Celebration of the Greek Revolution and honors the Greeks' fight for freedom. This day is also when the Feast of the Annunciation is commemorated; and

WHEREAS, within Greece and Cyprus a common feature of Greek Independence Day are local school parades in many villages, towns, and cities. Schoolchildren march in traditional Greek folk costumes and carry Greek flags. The largest celebration takes place in Athens where an annual military parade commemorates the event, attended by the president and other high ranking state officials, along with hundreds of civilian spectators; and

WHEREAS, Greece is a crucial NATO ally and friend of the United

States, and a leader for peace and prosperity in the Eastern Mediterranean, Black Sea, and Western Balkans regions; and

WHEREAS, on Greek Independence Day, we celebrate the history and values of the Hellenic Republic, and the courage, decency and honor that defines the Greek community, and their unwillingness to bend in the face of injustice; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby joins the Greek community in commemorating independence and the creation of the modern Greek state. Jacksonville City Council recognizes March 25, 2022 as Greek Independence Day and the Celebration of the Greek Revolution.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
