WHEREAS, PAL has touched the lives of hundreds of thousands of

Jacksonville's youths during its 50 years of outstanding service, and has been an invaluable resource by providing a safe environment for our youth and offering constructive alternatives to the temptations of challenged communities; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes and honors Jacksonville's Police Athletic League on the occasion of its 50th anniversary and recognizes the organization for its successful programming for youth in education, athletics, outreach, and teen leadership. The Council thanks the organization, its leaders, volunteers, and supporters for their outstanding work on behalf of Jacksonville's youth and extends its very best wishes for many more years of success.
