COAST NEWS AND MD ANDERSON CANCER CENTER FOR THEIR EFFORTS TO PROMOTE PREVENTION BY EARLY DETECTION OF BREAST CANCER THROUGH THE BUDDY MOBILE MAMMOGRAPHY BUDDY BUS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, breast cancer is the second most diagnosed cancer in women, affecting one in every eight women in the U.S., and is also diagnosed in men, and because the best defense against breast cancer is early detection, regular exams and mammograms are critically important; and

WHEREAS, Jeannie Blaylock of First Coast News, after losing a dear friend to breast cancer, took action to help prevent others from a similar fate by partnering with Baptist Health more than 30 years ago to bring about the Buddy Check campaign; and

WHEREAS, Buddy Check 12 has successfully served countless women in promoting its simple but vital strategy of "getting a buddy" and on the 12th of every month, known as Buddy Check Day, holding a buddy accountable for self-exams and for regular mammograms and physicals; and

WHEREAS, less than half of women in the U.S. get regular mammograms due to lack of accessibility, lack of insurance, or an inability to pay related costs, Baptist Health, Baptist MD Anderson

Cancer Center, and First Coast News raised \$1 million in funds needed for a mobile mammography unit that will focus on helping women around the First Coast discover breast cancer at early stages; and

WHEREAS, this mobile unit will be revealed on May 12, 2022, as "the Buddy Bus" and will offer state-of-the-art 3D screening mammography in a convenient and affordable setting with the goal to save the lives of mothers, daughters, grandmothers, sisters, best friends, and loved ones across the First Coast; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby commends Jeannie Blaylock, Baptist Health, and Baptist MD Anderson Cancer Center for all efforts leading to the creation of the Buddy Check 12 program and the Buddy Bus. The program and this mobile mammography unit demonstrate that screenings and early detection can save lives.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
