AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$157,172, INCLUDING \$117,879 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY ("FEMA") THROUGH THE STATE FLORIDA DIVISION OF OF **EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT UNDER THE FEMA HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM AND \$39,293 FROM GENERAL FUND RESERVE FOR FEDERAL PROGRAMS FOR THE REQUIRED 25% CITY MATCH, TO BE USED FOR INSTALLATION OF WIND RESISTANT BAY DOORS AT FIVE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE FIRE STATIONS, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-051; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT ΒY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (B.T. 22-051 attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference)
 - \$157,172.00

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of a \$117,879 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, distributed by the Florida Department of Emergency Management, and an appropriation of \$39,293 in General Fund Reserve for Federal Programs for the required 25% City match. These funds will be used to install wind resistant bay doors at five City of Jacksonville Fire Stations. The grant period commences upon execution of the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement by both parties and continues through February 28, 2024.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the installation of code compliant wind resistant bay doors at Fire Stations #1, #9, #30, #34 and #44. These new bay doors will meet the wind speed requirements in the area to prevent wind damage to these Fire Stations, their apparatus and contents from severe weather and other hazards. All materials utilized will provide protection against 146 mile per hour winds or the wind speed protection and impact requirements of the Florida Building Code at the time the permits are issued. A copy of the Federally-Funded Subaward Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: H0775) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division shall oversee the retrofit project and administration of the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
