RESOLUTION 2022-335-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE DUVAL SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT BOARD ON THEIR WORK AND COMMITMENT TO THE CONSERVATION, IMPROVEMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY OF OUR NATURAL RESOURCES; RECOGNIZING THE WEEK OF APRIL 24 - MAY 1 AS SOIL AND WATER STEWARDSHIP WEEK IN JACKSONVILLE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Duval Soil and Water Conservation District Board (SWCD) was created on July 10, 1953 under the authority created by the Soil Conservation Act, passed by Florida Legislature in 1937. The Duval SWCD was organized by concerned citizens of Duval County to help landowners and users to conserve land, water, forests, wildlife, and related natural resources. The current mission of the District is to plan, facilitate, and implement programs, projects, and practices that help conserve the natural resources throughout Duval County; and

WHEREAS, in 1955, the National Association of Conservation Districts began a national program to encourage Americans to focus on stewardship. The Stewardship Program relies on conservation districts sharing and promoting stewardship and conservation through field days, educational programming, and workshops to educate citizens about the need to care for our natural resources; and

WHEREAS, Soil and Water Stewardship Week is celebrated from the last Sunday in April to the first Sunday in May. In addition, it is recognized as one of the world's largest conservation-related observances. The activities during the week help to remind us of all of the power each person has to conserve natural resources and improve the world. When everyone works together with their local conservation district, that power continuously grows; and

WHEREAS, the SWCD Board, which consists of 5 non-partisan elected supervisors who serve at-large, is celebrating the 67th National Observance Week throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, the theme for this year's observance is "Healthy Soil: Healthy Life." Healthy, fertile soil and clean water are the lifeblood of nutrition and sustenance throughout the world. Soil conservation benefits everyone and effective conservation practices ensure soil, water, animals, plants, and air can provide a rich standard of living. Our survival and continued production of and access to quality food and water depends upon the robust management of diverse natural resources nationwide; and

WHEREAS, stewardship calls for each person to help conserve these precious resources for generations to come; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends the Duval Soil and Water Conservation District Board on their work and commitment to the citizens of Duval County to conserve, improve and sustain our natural resources.

Section 2. The Council hereby designates the week of April 24 to May 1, 2022 as "Soil and Water Stewardship Week" in Jacksonville and encourages all residents to learn about the vital importance of clean and healthy natural resources and to participate in the Stewardship Week activities.
