whereas, May 5th, or 'Cinco de Mayo'' in Spanish, is celebrated each year as a date of importance by Mexican and Mexican-American communities in commemoration of the date in 1862 on which the Mexican Army defeated the French at the Battle of Puebla, one of the many battles that the Mexican people won in their long and brave fight for independence, freedom, and democracy; and

WHEREAS, the victory of Mexico over France at Puebla represented a historic triumph for the Mexican government during the Franco-Mexican war fought between 1861 and 1867 and bolstered the resistance movement, reinvigorating the spirits of the Mexican people and providing a renewed sense of unity and strength through a victory over a major European power; and

WHEREAS, Cinco de Mayo serves as a reminder that the foundation of the United States was built by people from many countries and diverse cultures who were willing to fight and die for freedom; and

WHEREAS, Cinco de Mayo also serves as a reminder of the close ties between the people of Mexico and the people of the United States and encourages the celebration of a legacy of strong leaders and a

sense of vibrancy in communities; and

WHEREAS, Cinco de Mayo serves as a reminder of the tremendous contributions that Mexican-Americans have made to the economic, social, religious, and artistic fabric of American life and the need to provide even more opportunities for future generations to add to that great legacy; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes May 5th, as "Cinco de Mayo" in Jacksonville and honors the history and contributions of Mexicans and Mexican-Americans to our society. America's status as a vibrant and prosperous nation is due in no small part to the invaluable contributions of Mexican-American heritage and industry throughout our common history.

Section 2. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage upon introduction of this Resolution is requested in order to recognize the day, which occurs next week, in a timely manner.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
