AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$249,938, INCLUDING \$187,453.50 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY ("FEMA"), THROUGH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UNDER THE FEMA HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM, AND \$62,484.50 FROM GENERAL FUND RESERVE FOR FEDERAL PROGRAMS FOR THE REQUIRED 25% CITY MATCH, TO BE USED FOR INSTALLATION OF WIND RESISTANT BAY DOORS AND HURRICANE SHUTTERS AT THE COUNTY PORT SECURITY DISASTER WAREHOUSE (THE "PROJECT"), AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 22-057; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; AMENDING THE 2022-2026 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2021-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION FOR THE PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

 The funding above represents an appropriation of a \$187,453.50 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, distributed by the Florida Department of Emergency Management, and an appropriation of \$62,484.50 in General Fund Reserve for Federal Programs for the required 25% City match, for installation of wind resistant bay doors and hurricane shutters at the County Port Security Disaster Warehouse. Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the installation of code compliant wind resistant bay doors and hurricane shutters at the County Port Security Disaster Warehouse (one warehouse building) located at 909 Haines Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32206 (the "Project"). These new bay doors and hurricane-rated shutters will meet the wind speed requirements in the area to prevent wind damage to this facility. All materials utilized will provide protection against 143 mile per hour winds or the wind speed protection and impact requirements of the Florida Building Code at the time the permits are issued. A copy of the Federally-Funded Subaward Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: H0795) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance

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2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for completion of the Project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, April 18, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay the urgent need to wind retrofit the Disaster Warehouse with compliant bay doors and shutters prior to expiration of the grant.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division shall oversee the Project and administration of the grant described herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
