AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$226,707.63 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT'S FAIR HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TO RIGHTS JACKSONVILLE HUMAN COMMISSION ("JHRC") TO FUND JHRC FAIR HOUSING ASSISTANCE ACTIVITIES, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 22-048; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; CREATING A NEW SECTION 111.260 (JACKSONVILLE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION FAIR HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TRUST FUND), PART 2 (HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES), CHAPTER 111 (SPECIAL REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$226,707.63 from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Fair Housing Assistance Program to the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission ("JHRC") to fund JHRC fair housing assistance activities.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to fund JHRC fair housing assistance activities including fair housing complaint processing, administrative costs and training. JHRC will utilize the portion of the funds designated for fair housing complaint processing and administrative costs to pay the salaries, pension and benefits of its two housing investigators who are responsible for investigating allegations of discrimination under the federal Fair Housing Act and Chapter 408 (Fair Housing), City of Jacksonville Ordinance Code. In addition, the portion of the funds designated for training will be used for JHRC housing staff training in accordance with 24 CFR 115.306 which authorizes use of a portion of these funds for HUD-approved or HUD-sponsored Fair Housing Assistance Program training. A copy of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Assistance Award/Amendment documents providing the breakdown of funds awarded to JHRC and the authorized uses of said funds are attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Creating a new Section 111.260 (Jacksonville Human Rights Commission Fair Housing Assistance Program Trust Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code. A new Section 111.260 (Jacksonville Human Rights Commission Fair Housing Assistance Program Trust Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER 111. SPECIAL REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS

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PART 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

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Sec. 111.260. - Jacksonville Human Rights Commission Fair Housing Assistance Program Trust Fund.

There is hereby created within the General Trust and Agency Fund a trust fund account to be known as the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission Fair Housing Assistance Program Trust Fund (the "Fund"). The City and the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission shall deposit into the Fund all contributions of money, including grants or other payments, received from HUD's Fair Housing Assistance Program for use toward financing the fair housing activities of the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission. All sums placed into the Fund, together with any interest accrued thereon, are hereby appropriated for the benefit of the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission's fair housing assistance activities, and such appropriations shall not lapse at the close of any fiscal year but shall carry over to the next fiscal year. Such funds as are deposited into this trust account are to be self-appropriating when used for the purpose of financing the fair housing assistance activities of the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission as outlined in Section Ordinance Code. The Director of Finance Administration, or their designee, is authorized and directed to make disbursements from the Fund upon written request of the Executive Director of the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission, or their designee.

Section 4. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth

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herein, including renumbering of sections. Such editorial changes and any other changes necessary to make the *Ordinance Code* consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the *Ordinance Code* shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
