REPORT OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

The Planning and Development Department hereby forwards to the Planning Commission, Land Use and Zoning Committee, and City Council its comments and recommendations on:

ORDINANCE 2022-122

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), ORDINANCE CODE; CREATING A NEW SECTION 656.113 (PACKAGE STORE REVIEW PROCEDURE), SUBPART B (ADMINISTRATION), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO PROVIDE DISTRICT COUNCIL MEMBERS ADVANCED NOTICE OF PACKAGE LIQUOR STORE APPLICATION FILINGS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

The bill adds a new section to the Zoning Code to provide for notice to a district City Councilmember by the Planning and Development Department when a zoning application for a liquor store is filed for property in their district.

II. EVALUATION

A. The need and justification for the change

As a matter of practice, the Planning and Development Department sends paper copies of all new zoning applications to the district councilmember shortly after the application has been deemed complete. The Planning and Development Department keeps a log to assure that the applications have been sent over.

This legislation would add a requirement that the Chief of Current Planning shall make "direct contact" with the district councilmember via a telephone call or face to face meeting within five business days after a zoning application for a liquor store has been filed with the Planning and Development Department.

The Planning and Development Department recommends that in lieu of direct contact between the Chief and the district councilmember, the Chief or their designee shall send to the affected district councilmember an email containing a digital copy of the application within five business days. This method would assure the creation of an electronic record.

B. <u>The relationship of the proposed amendment to the Comprehensive Plan and the work of the</u> <u>Department with appropriate consideration as to whether the proposed amendment will</u> <u>further the purposes of the Zoning Code and Comprehensive Plan.</u>

This bill is consistent with the spirit and intent of both the Comprehensive Plan and the Zoning Code in that it is the intent of the legislation to protect and preserve the public health, safety and welfare of the people of the City of Jacksonville by promoting the awareness of zoning applications which could impact neighborhoods.

III. RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Development Department recommends that Ordinance 2022-122 be amended as described above and approved.

Part 1 19 (General Provisions), Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Ordinance Code, is 20 hereby amended to create a new Section 656.113 (Package Liquor Store 21 Review Procedure) as follows:

CHAPTER 656 - ZONING CODE * * * PART 1. - GENERAL PROVISIONS * * * SUBPART B. - ADMINISTRATION * * * Sec. 656.113. - Package Liquor Store Review Procedure. The purpose of this Section is to provide District Council Members advance notice of the filing of an application for:

regarding a package liquor store, as defined in Part 16 of the Zoning Code, so that the District Council Member may be notified in time to schedule a community meeting regarding the request if necessary.

8 As part of the application process for a package liquor store, 9 the Department shall notify within five (5) business days of the 10 application having been deemed complete, the District Council 11 Member within whose District the subject property lies. The 12 Department shall make direct contact with the District Council 13 Member regarding the application. For purposes of this Section, "direct contact" means a phone call or a meeting between the 14 District Council Member and the Chief of Current Planning. 15

16 Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 17 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 18 without the Mayor's signature.
