AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM; APPROPRIATING \$7,298,669.56 FOR PROGRAM COSTS, INITIATED BY B.T. 23-004; PROVIDING AWARD, AUTHORIZATION, AND FUNDING, AND FOR THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE TO EXECUTE FEDERAL PROGRAM CONTRACTS FOR CDBG PROGRAM FUNDS, AS APPLICABLE, B.T. 23-004; TO IMPLEMENT PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR FURTHER COUNCIL ACTION IF REVENUE DIFFERS; PROVIDING FOR THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND AWARD; DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE APPROVING POSITIONS AND PART-TIME HOURS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-003; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development annually awards Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funds to local governments on a formula basis that the local government may, in turn, award to qualified organizations to implement the CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the goals and objectives of the CDBG program are aimed at developing viable urban communities by providing decent affordable housing and a suitable living environment and associated supportive

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services to the most vulnerable in our communities, creating jobs through the expansion and retention of businesses, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate-income persons and families; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville is expected to receive \$7,298,669.56 in CDBG funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development on or about October 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34.203, Ordinance Code, the Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission (the "Commission") is designated as the agency responsible for making recommendations to the Housing and Community Development Division on all CDBG grant funding awards made to qualified subrecipients for community development and affordable housing initiatives and related programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has completed its 2022-2023 Universal Cycle application process and has recommended award of CDBG grant funding to the various entities, projects and programs described in B.T. 23-004 attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and the Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed use of CDBG funding, attached hereto as Exhibit 2, both of which are incorporated herein by this reference; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation and Authorization. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$7,298,669.56 in CDBG program grant funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to the City of Jacksonville for distribution to various award subrecipients selected pursuant to the Commission's 2022-2023 Universal Cycle for community development and affordable housing initiatives and related programs and services, and to other City departments as appropriate for the remaining awards, and the City of Jacksonville is authorized to enter into federal program

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contracts as appropriate and expend those funds in accordance with the awards identified in B.T. 23-004.

For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b) of B.T. 23-004:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of CDBG program funding received from HUD and will be spent on public services, economic development, public facilities, and any costs associated with administration or delivery of the CDBG program.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation set forth in Section 1 above is to expend the 2022-2023 available federal CDBG program income received from HUD, to award federal contracts (as appropriate) for the CDBG program, and to provide funding to various qualified organizations in the amounts set forth in B.T. 23-004 and the Schedule of Proposed Funding.

In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of CDBG funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the

Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds.

Section 4. Further Council Action. If HUD approves a different allocation of CDBG grant funds than is appropriated by this Ordinance, then the Mayor shall submit a supplementary budget to City Council for approval in accordance with the actual allocation

There 6 Section 6. hereby are 7 approved the positions and part-time hours more fully described in R.C. 23-003, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by 8 9 this reference. Said positions are fully funded by CDBG grant dollars 10 and will provide services in support of the CDBG program. 11 Section 7. Effective Date.
