DEDICATION OF THE DUVAL COUNTY COURTHOUSE JURY

WHEREAS, Daniel Webster Perkins was born in 1879 in Elizabeth City, North Carolina, and earned college degrees from North Carolina State Normal College and Temple University, and his law degree from Shaw University Law School; and

WHEREAS, D.W. Perkins, Esquire, was admitted to the Florida Bar in 1914, and one year later he argued a landmark case before the Florida Supreme Court to integrate juries; and

WHEREAS, after practicing law in Knoxville, Tennessee and Tampa, Florida, D.W. Perkins moved to Jacksonville in 1919 where he practiced law until his death in 1972; and

WHEREAS, throughout his career, D.W. Perkins held positions of trust in a myriad of professional, educational, civic and political organizations. He was a staunch proponent of civil rights and community activism, and was a mentor and role model to generations of African American attorneys; and

WHEREAS, in 1968, the former Colored Lawyers Association changed its name to the Daniel Webster Perkins Bar Association, Inc. in honor of founding member D.W. Perkins, the great legal pioneer and one of the first African Americans to practice law in Duval County. In 2019, D.W. Perkins was inducted into the Florida Civil Rights Hall of Fame;

WHEREAS, the Duval County Courthouse houses courtrooms and judges from the Duval County and Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts. Construction began on the new facility downtown in 2009, and it opened in 2012; and

WHEREAS, the right to a trial by jury is a principle enshrined in the U.S. Constitution, and jury service is fundamental to our American legal system, and prospective jurors should reflect a cross-section of all members of the local community; and

WHEREAS, in celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the Duval County Courthouse, the Jury Assembly Room will be dedicated in honor of D.W. Perkins, the distinguished lawyer, community leader and prominent civil rights supporter. The dedication ceremony at the Duval County Courthouse will be held on Wednesday, June 15, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors the memory of Daniel Webster Perkins, his historical contribution to our city, and his lifetime of achievements. Jacksonville City Council celebrates the dedication of the Duval County Courthouse Jury Assembly Room, to be named in D.W. Perkins' honor.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
