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## ORDINANCE 2022-266-E

> The funding is an appropriation of \$336,000 (\$186,000 from the City Council President Contingency account and \$150,000 from the Council Member - Legislative Contingency - CD 7 account) to a contingency account to be utilized by the Safety Reduction Commission and Crime to make

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recommendations to the City Council to reduce crime countywide.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding to reduce crime county wide. The Safety and Crime Reduction Commission will make recommendations of programs to Council and the Council will address the recommendations through separate legislation.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2022-2023.
