A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING BISHOP PAUL ZINK ON A LIFETIME OF SERVICE THROUGH CHURCHES AND SCHOOL; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Bishop Paul Zink, born in Brazil, Indiana, grew up in several cities around the country as the son of Rev. Dale C. Zink, who pastored churches in Ohio, Indiana, Texas, and Florida, including serving as Pastor of the Southside Assembly of God on Philips Highway in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, Paul Zink attended Southeastern College in Lakeland, Florida before earning his bachelor's degree at Zoe College (now Zoe University) in Jacksonville. He then followed in his father's footsteps, first as the choir director and then as his successor as Pastor of Southside Assembly of God; and

WHEREAS, following a brief stint with a church in Maine, Bishop Zink and his wife Sharon returned to Jacksonville in 1984 and founded New Life Christian Fellowship on Hodges Boulevard in East Arlington, a church that has grown in size and impact in the nearly 40 succeeding years. In 2014, Bishop Zink turned over the pastorship of New Life Christian Fellowship to his son, Rev. Paul Zink II to take new directions in his work; and

WHEREAS, in 1997 Bishop Zink achieved one of his greatest goals with the founding of the Providence School on the New Life campus. From a modest start, the school has grown to be one of the premier private educational institutions in Jacksonville, promoting academic, spiritual, artistic and athletic excellence in an atmosphere of deeply-felt values and high standards. Today the school enrolls over

1,500 students in grades K-12 and has earned a reputation for outstanding achievement in every area of its curriculum; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Zink has spent decades in the field of ministry, helping to found and run ministries and churches where he was called, and serving on the boards of directors of leading institutions such as Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Oklahoma and the Yoido Full Gospel Church, the world's largest religious congregation, headquartered in Seoul, South Korea; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Bishop Paul Zink for his lifetime of service to the community through his religious and educational ministries. Bishop Zink has devoted his life, as did his father before him and as his sons are also doing, to serving the spiritual, temporal and educational needs of his congregants and has founded and grown two of Jacksonville's signature institutions. The Council wishes Bishop Zink many more years of faithfilled, productive service to society.
