A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND NUMEROUS ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF SOLLIE MITCHELL; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Sollie Mitchell, a native of Ocilla, Georgia, was born in June of 1918, graduated from Stanton High School in Jacksonville and attended the institution that later became Florida Memorial College, then located in St. Augustine; and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Mitchell was drafted to serve in the U.S. Army in 15 World War II and was a company clerk at Fort Benning, Georgia, and a firearms instructor at the Aberdeen Proving Ground in Maryland before 16 17 seeing combat in the Pacific Theater in the Philippines and New Guinea and serving as a clerk on the staff at the headquarters of General 18 19 Douglas McArthur. His military service ended with the rank of staff 20 sergeant after a tour in Japan as part of the U.S. occupying force after the end of the war; and 21

22 WHEREAS, returning to the United States in late 1945, Sollie 23 Mitchell became a Pullman porter with the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad 24 and a member of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters where he 25 renewed his family's long-time acquaintance with civil rights pioneer 26 A. Philip Randolph and became the Secretary of the Jacksonville 27 chapter of the union and a trusted assistant to Mr. Randolph. A 28 highlight of his career with the railroad came in 1963 when he was 29 the only Pullman porter serving on the Freedom Train that carried passengers from Jacksonville to the famous March on Washington where 30 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered his "I have a dream" speech; 31

2 WHEREAS, Mr. Mitchell had a lifelong dedication to service and 3 education, and that exhibited itself most prominently in his decades of membership and active participation in the Alpha Phi Alpha 4 5 Fraternity and Prince Hall Freemasonry. He was coronated a Sovereign Grand Inspector General of the Southern Jurisdiction in 1993 and 6 7 attended nearly 40 United Supreme Council sessions. He was named an Honorary Past Master of the Most Worshipful Union Grand Lodge of 8 9 Florida, Sovereign Grand Commander Emeritus, and Honorary Past 10 Imperial Potentate, and the Prince Hall Lodge in downtown Jacksonville was named the Sollie Mitchell Lodge #377 in his honor; and 11

WHEREAS, Sollie Mitchell married Mary Alva Barnett in 1951 and was as devoted to her for 62 years before her passing as he was to the Historic Mt. Zion AME Church where he worshiped for decades; and

WHEREAS, it was with deep sadness that the Council learned of the recent passing of the legendary Sollie Mitchell at the age of 103; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

19 Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates 20 the life and countless accomplishments of pioneering civil rights and 21 labor movement leader Sollie Mitchell and extends to his family, 22 friends, and many admirers the City's sincere condolences on his 23 passing. Mr. Mitchell was a legendary figure in Jacksonville and his 24 wealth of first-hand historical knowledge of some of the great events 25 in our nation's history and his dedication to the improvement of his 26 community will be greatly missed.
