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#### ORDINANCE 2022-450

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 117 (GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE; AMENDING SECTIONS 117.101 (INTENT), 117.102 (APPLICATION), 117.105 (RECORDS), AND 117.108 (CASH OVERMATCH ON GRANT TO BE DISCLOSED) TO INCLUDE DEFINITIONS AND PROVISIONS FOR PRIVATE GRANTS AND CREATING NEW SECTIONS 117.111 (STATE AND FEDERAL AWARDS TO FOLLOW UNIFORM PROCUREMENT RULES OR PROCUREMENT CODE) AND 117.112 (REPORTING), CHAPTER 117 (GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes that the citizens of Jacksonville have an expectation that the City of Jacksonville will expend public funds in a fair and equitable manner and will follow the processes set forth in the Ordinance Code; and

21 WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to ensure that public 22 funds are distributed in a fair and transparent manner; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 2021-761-E, the Council approved changes to Chapter 118 (City Grants) to require that nonprofits receiving funding from the City participate in a competitive evaluated award process; and

27 WHEREAS, the Council desires to amend Chapter 117 (Grants) to 28 clarify that state and federal grant awards must comply with State 29 and Federal requirements for funding received through federal or 30 state grants, including 2 CFR Part 200-Uniform Administrative 31 Requirements, Costs Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR 200) and Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance
Code, where applicable; now therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Amending Sections 117.101 (Intent), 117.102 4 Section 1. 5 (Application), 117.105 (Records), and 117.108 (Cash overmatch on grant to be disclosed) and creating new Sections 117.111 (State and 6 7 federal awards to follow Uniform Federal or State Procurement Rules 8 or Procurement Code) and 117.112 (Reporting), Ordinance Code. Chapter 117 (Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to amend 9 Sections 117.101, 117.102, 117.105, and 117.108 and to create new 10 Sections 117.111 and 117.112 to read as follows: 11

#### CHAPTER 117. GRANTS

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### Sec. 117.101. Definition and Intent.

The term "application" as used in this Chapter shall mean an electronic, digital, written or other form of application, certification, affidavit or other document required by a federal, state, or other public or private entity to be submitted to receive a grant from such entity.

20 The term "grant" or "grants" as used in this chapter shall 21 include any federal grants, state grants, or other public or private 22 grants that the City applies for pursuant to this Chapter.

The grants and projects generally described in the catalog for Federal Domestic Assistance are in the best interests of the public. The grants and projects that are from time to time made available to the City by the State of Florida <u>or other public or private entities</u> are in the best interest of the public. The City should undertake available projects from both federal and state sources in the furtherance of the public health, welfare and recreation.

## 30 Sec. 117.102. Application.

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The Mayor is authorized to make application and execute

necessary contracts and other documents in the form prescribed by the 1 2 United States Government for grants to be made to the City to assist 3 in defraying the costs of the projects generally described in the catalog referred to in Section 117.101. The Mayor is further 4 5 authorized to make application and execute necessary contracts and 6 other documents in the form prescribed by the State of Florida or 7 other public or private entities for grants to be made to the City to assist in defraying the cost of projects for the furtherance of 8 the public health, welfare and recreation as may be available from 9 the State of Florida or other public or private entities from time 10 11 to time. The Mayor is authorized to (i) execute grant applications 12 electronically and digitally as required by the entity providing a grant to the City; and (ii) delegate any authority granted under this 13 14 Chapter in accordance with Section 20.107, Ordinance Code.

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Sec. 117.105. Records.

17 If the grants are made, the City, as directed by the Mayor, 18 shall maintain such records as are necessary and furnish such 19 information, data and documents as are required by the appropriate 20 United States, or State of Florida, or other public or private 21 <u>entities, agency</u> under the applicable federal or state laws <u>or other</u> 22 <u>grant regulations</u> to support implementation of the projects generally 23 described in the application.

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## Sec. 117.108. Cash Overmatch on grant to be disclosed.

If the Council is requested to appropriate City funds as a match for federal, <del>or</del> state, or other public or private grant funds and the amount requested to be appropriated exceeds the amount that is required by federal, <del>or</del> state, or other public or private regulations to be made available for match, this fact shall be disclosed by the Mayor to the Council at the time the appropriation is requested.
