A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING SHERIFF
MIKE WILLIAMS FOR HIS THREE DECADES OF SERVICE
TO THE CITY AND CITIZENS OF JACKSONVILLE;
PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Sheriff Mike Williams, a Jacksonville native, graduated from Bishop Kenny High School, earned his Bachelor of Science degree in multi-disciplinary studies at Liberty University in Virginia, and participated in numerous other training and educational opportunities, including studying at the FBI's National Executive Institute; and

WHEREAS, after serving in the Florida Air National Guard, Mr. Williams joined the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office in 1991 and steadily progressed through the ranks from a patrol officer to sergeant to lieutenant and detective, during which time he had assignments as diverse as the SWAT team, Seaport Security Unit, Gang Investigations and Gun Crime Investigations units, and the "Offender Watch" program; and

WHEREAS, Mike Williams was appointed as Assistant Division Chief of the Narcotics and Vice Section in 2008-2010; was promoted to Division Chief of Homeland Security/Narcotics-Vice in 2010-2013; and was appointed Director of the Department of Investigations and Homeland Security in 2012; and

WHEREAS, in 2015 the citizens of Jacksonville elected Mike Williams as their Sheriff, and re-elected him to a second term in 2019; and

WHEREAS, since being elected to serve the City of Jacksonville

as its fifth Sheriff, Mike Williams has demonstrated his commitment to driving down violent crime by leveraging newer technology including body cameras and gunfire detection systems to solve crimes. He grew the public's trust in the JSO through his mandate for enhanced transparency, he continued to highlight the use of diversion programming, and he increased mental health and special needs awareness among officers and the public JSO serves; and

WHEREAS, Sheriff Williams continued the JSO's history of promoting advanced training and the pursuit of accreditation for the department in various specialties, ensuring that Jacksonville's law enforcement personnel are meeting the highest objective standards for preparedness and performance; and

WHEREAS, Sheriff Mike Williams recently announced his retirement from the Office of Sheriff and the Council wishes to commend him on his outstanding law enforcement career; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Sheriff Mike Williams for three decades of outstanding service to the citizens and the City of Jacksonville on the occasion of his retirement. The Council extends its thanks on behalf of the people of Jacksonville for his dedication to duty and commitment to the safety and security of the city, and extends its best wishes for many years of health and happiness.
