Type of Action: Approval of Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity

Bill Summary: This bill grants an initial Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CON) to Independence Recycling of Florida, Inc. to operate the Clean Debris Recycling Facility located at 1600 Talleyrand Avenue, Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida 32206. This Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity shall be valid for a period of five (5) years from the effective date.

Background Information: A certificate of public convenience and necessity is a permit issued by a public body that is charged with the supervision of public facilities, e.g., carriers or public utilities and it authorizes the holder of the permit to operate such a public facility within a particular area. The issuance of the certificate is made after application, notice, and hearing. Based upon recommendations of the Director of the Planning and Development Department, the Chief of the Solid Waste Division, the Chief of the Environmental Quality Division, and the Florida Department of Health in Duval County, it is deemed that the Facility would serve the public convenience and provide a needed service to the citizens of Duval County. The facility proposes to accept up to 5,000 tons of clean debris per day (mainly concrete).
