AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,127,609.25 FROM THE FRCP FIRE STATIONS CAPITAL PROJECTS - FIRE CONTROL/FIRE STATION #64 (NEW) - DM LAND ACCOUNT TO THE FRCP FIRE STATIONS CAPITAL PROJECTS - FIRE CONTROL/FIRE STATION #64 (NEW) - DM OTHER CONSTRUCTION COSTS ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION OF FIRE STATION #64, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-089; AMENDING THE 2021-2025 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2021-505-E TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "FIRE STATION #64 (NEW)"; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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Stations Capital Projects -Fire Control/Fire Station #64 (New) - DM Land Account to the FRCP Fire Stations Capital Projects -Fire Control/Fire Station #64 (New) - DM Other Construction Costs Account. No match and no staff obligations are required. This project was identified in the City's 2012-2016 Capital Improvement Program and Tri Data report to reduce times for emergency services and EMS runs.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to complete the construction of Fire Station #64 at Dunn Avenue and Harts Road. Land has been purchased for Fire Station #64 and the remaining funds in the land account are necessary to complete construction of the station.

CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, being the Section 3. 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for the project entitled "Fire Station #64 (New)." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will delay the urgent need to complete construction of the fire station and provide necessary services in this area. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2019-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

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Section 4. Requesting one cycle emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that a delay would be detrimental to the best interests of the community because there is an urgent need to complete the construction in order to reduce response times and provide necessary emergency services in this area.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
