Stations Capital Projects -Fire Control/Fire Station #64 (New) - DM Land Account to the FRCP Fire Stations Capital Projects -Fire Control/Fire Station #64 (New) - DM Other Construction Costs Account. No match and no staff obligations are required. This project was identified in the City's 2012-2016 Capital Improvement Program and Tri Data report to reduce times for emergency services and EMS runs.

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9 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 10 Section 1 is to complete the construction of Fire Station #64 at Dunn 11 Avenue and Harts Road. Land has been purchased for Fire Station #64 12 and the remaining funds in the land account are necessary to complete 13 construction of the station.

CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, being the 14 Section 3. 15 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide 16 17 additional funding for the project entitled "Fire Station #64 (New)." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, 18 19 attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this 20 reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of 21 the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be 22 detrimental to the best interests of the community because such 23 deferral will delay the urgent need to complete construction of the 24 fire station and provide necessary services in this area. Pursuant 25 to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance 26 requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members 27 present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this 28 section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 29 2019-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall continue in full force 30 and effect. 31
