RESOLUTION 2022-472-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE GAMMA RHO OMEGA CHAPTER OF ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SORORITY, INCORPORATED ON THE OCCASION OF THE ANNIVERSARY OF ITS FOUNDING; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Gamma Rho Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha, WHEREAS, Incorporated was chartered in Jacksonville on June 23, 1942 when ten college-educated, enterprising, dedicated and civic-minded young women who had become members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. on various college campuses became the Chapter's charter members; and

WHEREAS, throughout its history, Gamma Rho Omega Chapter has been committed to and actively engaged in service to the community. In 1942, the year of the chapter's charter, the chapter held a Thanksgiving Basket project, and subsequent projects throughout the decades have included the college scholarship program, registration drives, voters information projects, reading tutorial programs, the Ebony Fashion Show, the Camp Blanding Troops project, the Shoe Fund for school age children, assistance to the Clara White Mission, Christmas Seal Drive, and countless other initiatives to enhance the community, strengthen families, support education and better the lives of the underserved; and

WHEREAS, for 80 years, Gamma Rho Omega Chapter has provided scholarships for young women seeking to further their education, promoted leadership development in the Chapter and the community,

supported historically black colleges and universities, addressed community health issues, supported organizations such as the American Cancer Society and the American Red Cross, and supported service organizations such as the NAACP, the National Council of Negro Women, and the United Negro College Fund. Most recently the chapter developed and implemented a Jacksonville Black Historical Bus Tour and created a virtual tour and installed bronze markers at notable Black historical sites in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, as an affirmation of its commitment to education and preparing young women for leadership roles in the community, the nation and the world, Gamma Rho Omega Chapter sponsors three undergraduate chapters: Nu Iota at Edward Waters College, Mu Theta at the University of North Florida, and Omicron Delta at Jacksonville University; and

WHEREAS, on January 23, 1952, Gamma Rho Omega chapter sponsored nationally acclaimed opera star Marian Anderson in concert in Jacksonville, thus becoming the first organization to present a program to an integrated audience in the city. The chapter received national recognition for this accomplishment; and

WHEREAS, the Gamma Rho Omega Chapter proudly produced the 25th International President (1998-2002) of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, Norma Solomon White, a Jacksonville native who graduated from Stanton High School, earned her bachelor's degree at Florida A&M University, took her master's degree from Columbia University, worked in the music program of the Jacksonville public school system, and was the first African American to win the EVE Award in Fine Arts; and

WHEREAS, during the past four years, 2018-2022, under the International Program theme Exemplifying Excellence Through Sustainable Service, Gamma Rho Omega has implemented its Signature Program, #CAPSM and numerous initiatives along with five program

targets that included HBCU support, health and wellness, the arts, and economic well-being and seven local Community Impact Days; and

WHEREAS, as Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Gamma Rho Omega Chapter celebrates its 80th Anniversary, its members can reflect with considerable pride on the many outstanding, significant contributions the Chapter has made in service projects in Jacksonville and its continuing efforts to serve humanity, and we take this opportunity to honor and commend Gamma Rho Omega Chapter for that great work; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council does hereby honor and commend the Gamma Rho Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated on the occasion of its 80th anniversary and wishes the Chapter continued successes in the years ahead.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
