8 APPROPRIATING \$11,143,940, INCLUDING
9 \$9,744,730.00 IN ANNUAL STATE HOUSING
10 INITIATIVES PARTNERSHIP (SHIP) PROGRAM GRANT
11 FUNDING FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC
12 OPPORTUNITY, THROUGH THE FLORIDA HOUSING FINANCE
13 CORPORATION, AND \$1,399,210 IN PROGRAM INCOME,
14 TO SERVE VERY LOW, LOW, AND MODERATE-INCOME
15 FAMILIES, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 22-075;
16 PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; APPROVING POSITIONS,
17 AS INITIATED BY R.C. 22-117; PROVIDING FOR AN
18 EFFECTIVE DATE.

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20 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,
22 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
23 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
24 listed in subsection (b):

26 as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev B.T. 22-075, June 6, 2022 - NCSPHS" and
27 incorporated herein by this reference):

2 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

3 The funding above is an appropriation of \$11,143,940,
4 including \$9,744,730.00 in annual grant funds from Florida
5 Department of Economic Opportunity, through the Florida
6 Housing Finance Corporation, and \$1,399,210 in program
7 income. These funds will be used to support the State
8 Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) program. The SHIP
9 program grant and income funds must be committed to
10 eligible projects no later than June 30, 2023 and must be
11 fully expended for completed projects no later than June
12 30, 2024.

13 **Section 2. Purpose.** The Florida Housing Finance
14 Corporation provides funding to local governments as an incentive to
15 create partnerships that produce and preserve affordable
16 homeownership and multifamily housing. The SHIP program was designed
17 to serve very low, low, and moderate-income families. SHIP funds may
18 be used for emergency repairs, new construction, rehabilitation, down
19 payment and closing costs assistance, acquisition of property for
20 affordable housing, matching dollars for federal housing grants and
21 programs, homeownership counseling and the Foreclosure Intervention
22 Program. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses
23 of the SHIP funds is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled
24 as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Schedule, June 6, 2022 - NCSPHS" and
25 incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the state of Florida
26 Projected SHIP Estimates for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is attached hereto
27 as **Exhibit 3**.

28 **Section 3. Approval of Positions.** There are hereby
29 approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 22-117, attached
30 hereto as **Exhibit 4** and incorporated herein by this reference. Said
31 positions are fully funded by SHIP grant dollars and will provide

1 services in support of the SHIP program.

2 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
4 without the Mayor's signature.
