AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$3,100,694 ΙN HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS PROGRAM GRANT FUNDING TO PROVIDE HOUSING ASSISTANCE AND RELATED SUPPORTIVE SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE LOW-INCOME PERSONS LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS AND THEIR FAMILIES WITHIN DUVAL INCLUDING \$2,720,736 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND \$379,958 IN ADDITIONAL CARES ACT RELIEF, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 23-002; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; APPROVING A PROGRAM MANAGER POSITION, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-002; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$3,100,694 in grant funds for the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program, including \$2,720,736 from the Department of Housing and Urban Development and \$379,958 in additional CARES Act relief. The HOPWA program is administered by the Housing and Community Development Division and was established to provide housing assistance and related supportive services to eligible low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for housing assistance and related supportive services to eligible low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families. The HOPWA program provides funding that can be used for a wide range of housing, social services, program planning, and development cost expenditures for eligible persons and their families. Housing assistance may include the acquisition, rehabilitation or new construction of housing units, costs for facility operations, rental assistance, and short-term payments to prevent homelessness. In addition, an essential component to providing housing assistance for this targeted, special needs population is the coordination and delivery of supportive services. Consequently, HOPWA funds may also be used for services that include, but are not limited to, assessment and case management, substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment, nutritional services, job training and placement assistance, and assistance with daily living

activities. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of HOPWA funds is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Schedule, June 6, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the award letters are attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**.

Section 3. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds. In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of HOPWA funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission for award of HOPWA funds.

Section 4. Approval of Position. There is hereby approved the Program Manager position more fully described in R.C. 23-002, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference. Said position is fully funded by HOPWA grant dollars and will provide services in support of the HOPWA program.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
