## (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$570,440 in annual grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program. The City is required to match ESG funds with an equal amount of cash and/or non-cash contributions which may include donated buildings, materials, and volunteer services. The City accomplishes this match requirement through programs and funding provided by the Social Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department. In addition, all ESG funds must be expended within 24 months after HUD signs the grant agreement.

The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Purpose. Section 1 is to provide funding for services and activities aimed at addressing homelessness and that meet ESG program goals and This includes activities and services that: i) engage homeless individuals and families living on the street; ii) improve the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals and families; iii) help operate these shelters; iv) provide essential services to shelter residents; v) rapidly re-house homeless individuals and families; and vi) prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless. A portion of the ESG funds will be used for costs associated with administration of the ESG program. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of ESG funds is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Schedule, June 6, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the HUD grant award letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.
