AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$900,000.00 FROM THE SYSTEM DRAINAGE REHABILITATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT TO THE MYRTLE AVENUE STORMWATER PUMP REPLACEMENT PROJECT (THE "PROJECT") TO OFFSET HIGHER THAN ESTIMATED COSTS FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-083; AMENDING THE 2022-2026 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2021-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION OF FROM THEDRAINAGE SYSTEM FUNDS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT TO THE MYRTLE AVENUE STORMWATER PUMP REPLACEMENT PROJECT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$900,000.00 from the Drainage System Rehabilitation Capital Improvements project to the Myrtle Avenue Stormwater Pump Replacement project (the "Project") to offset higher than estimated costs for the Project.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding to offset the higher than estimated costs for the Myrtle Avenue Stormwater Pump Replacement project. This is a result of unforeseen work items and drastic price increases for project materials and labor. Reallocation of these funds will allow a critical improvement to this drainage system to be completed and will serve as a permanent solution to ongoing flooding in the Myrtle Avenue tunnel. Installation of the replacement pump will also allow the temporary bypass system, which has proven to be unreliable and costly to maintain, to be abandoned.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for completion of the Project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP, July 19, 2022 - Finance" and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay completion of the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section.
