A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA STUDENT MORGAN RAY ON WINNING А SILVER MEDAL ΙN THE MEN'S 100-METER BREASTSTROKE IN THE 2022 WORLD PARA SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS ΙN PORTUGAL; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Morgan Ray, a St. Johns County native, graduated from Bartram Trail High School and is currently a rising sophomore at the University of North Florida (UNF); and

16 WHEREAS, shortly after his birth, Mr. Ray was diagnosed with 17 achondroplasia, a genetic condition that affects the development of 18 bone tissue and is the most frequent form of dwarfism, which caused 19 him to stop growing at the age of 6; and

20 WHEREAS, Morgan Ray has spent most of his life swimming 21 competitively, first in the River City Swim League, then on the 22 Bartram Trail swim team, and subsequently training with coach Cameron 23 Bendetsen and the Bolles Sharks swim team as UNF does not sponsor a 24 men's swimming team; and

WHEREAS, inspired by a meeting with Gainesville, Florida native Miranda Uhl, another swimmer with achondroplasia who won a gold medal in the women's 200 individual medley during the 2008 Paralympics in Beijing, Mr. Ray has trained intensively for years with the goal of being a medal contender at the Paralympics and other international competitions; and

WHEREAS, Morgan Ray made his national-level breakthrough at the

Paralympic Canadian-American Open Swimming Championships in December 2017 in Charlotte, winning four gold medals and shortly thereafter qualifying for USA Swimming's national team; and

WHEREAS, after missing out on his goal of Paralympic competition in 2020 in Tokyo with the cancellation of the event due to the COVID pandemic, Mr. Ray qualified for the recent World Para Swimming Championships on the island of Madeira, Portugal and brought home a silver medal in the men's 100-meter breaststroke from the competition; now therefore
