WHEREAS, Melva Jackson, a native of Marietta, Georgia, moved to Jacksonville as a child. She graduated from the John Gorrie School and Lee and Jones Business College and worked at Camp Blanding during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Jackson, a bookkeeper by profession, has been an active and involved resident of the Spanish Point neighborhood in East Arlington for many decades, and is fondly known as the "First Lady of Spanish Point"; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Jackson, who has outlived several of her fellow active participants in the civic association, recently turned over her duties to a new generation of officers in order to enjoy a well-deserved retirement; and

WHEREAS, Melva Jackson is a shining example of a caring, contributing citizen, selflessly devoting time and effort on a voluntary basis to improve and maintain her neighborhood for the

benefit of all its residents; and

WHEREAS, this sort of civic pride and activism is deserving of recognition and praise; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Melva Jackson, the "First Lady of Spanish Point", for her decades of service to her neighborhood and to the city. Her brand of civic pride and activism is the bedrock of successful communities and is greatly appreciated by all who have benefited from her efforts over the course of many, many years. The Council extends is congratulations for all her selfless service to others.
