A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING ROBIN PATRICE SUMMERS-MURRAY ON HER LONG AND DEDICATED CAREER AS A DUVAL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS TEACHER; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Robin Patrice Summers-Murray, a Jacksonville native, graduated from Andrew Jackson High School, earned an associate's degree in elementary education from Florida Community College at Jacksonville and took her bachelor's degree in elementary and special education from Edward Waters College; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Summers-Murray began her career with Duval County Public Schools in 1984 as a paraprofessional at R.L. Brown 6th Grade Center for five years and then moved to Cedar Hills Elementary School where she taught special education and varying exceptionalities from 1990 to 2016. After 26 years at Cedar Hills, she transferred to Hyde Grove Elementary where she taught until her retirement in June of 2022; and

WHEREAS, education was a love of Robin Summers-Murray from a very young age and teaching was always her career goal. Realizing the challenges faced by students with special needs, she learned the skills and earned the certification to make that her specialty and thereafter spent her career focusing on students with learning disabilities. She demonstrated daily her belief that every student deserves respect and preparation for adulthood in a world that may not understand their disability; and

WHEREAS, her teaching and mentorship of special needs students

extended beyond the classroom setting. For several years she actively coached her school's Special Olympics teams and oversaw recruitment and training of volunteers for special education events. She developed tailored lesson plans to match each student's particular needs, and she also provided food and clothing to children facing difficult circumstances to ensure their ability to be fully prepared to learn in school; and

WHEREAS, after a teaching career spanning nearly four decades that merits commendation, Robin Summers-Murray has taken a well-deserved retirement; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Robin Patrice Summers-Murray on her long and dedicated career as a special education teacher for Duval County Public Schools and thanks her for her invaluable service to Jacksonville's youth. Her dedication to those of our children with learning disabilities and special needs is particularly commendable and heartwarming. The City Council extends its congratulations and best wishes for many years of health and happiness in her retirement.
