Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the 18 19 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to 20 the account(s) listed in subsection (b): 21 (B.T. 22-110, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein 22 by this reference) 23 (a) Appropriated from: 24 See B.T. 22-110 \$1,369,117 25 (b) Appropriated to: 26 See B.T. 22-110 \$1,369,117 27 Explanation of Appropriation: (C) 2.8 The funding above represents an appropriation of grant 29 funding in the amount of \$1,369,117 from the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) for 30 the Wills Branch Creek Dredge Project. 31

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to provide funding to dredge approximately 42,213 cubic yards of sediment and vegetation from the bottom of Wills Branch Creek and an additional 1,156 cubic yards from the creek embankment (the "Project"). The dredging will occur from Old Middleburg Road to approximately 2000 feet east of Lane Avenue. The Project will also include the addition of rip rap reinforcement and plantings along the creek embankment. This area is one of the main drainage pathways along the St. Johns River and historically been prone to flooding. The Project will provide crucial flood relief and increased resilience for the residential properties along Wills Branch Creek. A copy of the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection Standard Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: 22FRP101) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.

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Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reflect additional funding for the Project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delay of the Project and loss of grant funding for the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall

constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Oversight. The Public Works Department shall oversee administration of the grant and the Project described herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
