AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$85,161.00 INCLUDING \$71,076.00 IN ADDITIONAL GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA), THROUGH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DIVISION EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UNDER THE FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM, AND \$14,085.00 FROM FRCP FIRE STATIONS CAPITAL PROJECTS - EMERGENCY AND DISASTER RELIEF SERVICES -PROFESSIONAL SERVICES, TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6734 BAKERSFILED DRIVE (R.E. NO. 012147-0000) WITH THE INTENT TO DEMOLISH THE RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE LOCATED THEREON (THE "PROJECT"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-113; AMENDING THE 2022-2026 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2021-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION FOR THE PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The funding above represents an appropriation of additional Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Program funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$71,076.00 and an appropriation of \$14,085.00 from FRCP Fire Stations Capital Projects - Emergency and Disaster Relief Services - Other Professional Services for acquisition of property on Bakersfield Drive. No local match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is provide additional funding for acquisition of that certain property identified by the FEMA National Flood Insurance Program as a "Severe Repetitive Loss Property", located at 6734 Bakersfield Drive (R.E. No. 012147-0000) (the "Property"), with the intent to demolish the private residential structure located thereon. This grant was initially approved by Ordinance 2021-47-E, including an appropriation of \$310,974.00 for the Project. Subsequent to this initial approval and appropriation, an independent appraisal of the Property was conducted which reflected a higher-than-budgeted appraised value for the Property. FEMA has agreed to increase the grant award by \$71,076.00 to acquire the Property and demolish the structure as outlined in the Modification to Subgrant Agreement Between the Division of Emergency Management and City of Jacksonville a copy of which has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services. The remaining \$14,085.00 appropriated herein

acquisition of the Property will come from reallocation of other management and contingency costs budgeted for the Project. The total purchase price for the Property will be \$340,000.00 and the new total Project cost is \$382,050.00.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for completion of the Project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay urgently-needed mitigation of this flood-prone property and the safe removal of residents from the immediate dangers of flooding. The Property is located in an area that is subject to persistent nuisance flooding and the Project will reduce future costs to the county, state and federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services in the area.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division shall oversee the Project and administration of the grant described herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
