Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, 20 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated 21 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 22 listed in subsection (b): (B.T. 22-112, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein 23 24 by this reference) 25 (a) Appropriated from: \$2,500,000 See B.T. 22-112 26 27 (b) Appropriated to: See B.T. 22-112 \$2,500,000 2.8 29 (c) Explanation of appropriation: The funding above is a reallocation of funds from the Fire 30

Station No. 47 Land and Engineering and Design Accounts to

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the Fire Station No. 47 Other Construction Costs Account to pay for completion of construction of the new Fire Station No. 47.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is reallocate funds to complete the construction of Fire Station No. 47 which will be located on Ethel Road. Land has been acquired for this new station and this project was identified in the City's 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program and the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department's 2020 Capital Study to reduce response times for fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) runs. remaining funds are necessary to complete construction of the new station.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to transfer \$2,500,000 (\$500,000 from the Fire Station No. 47 Design and Engineering Expenditures/Project Phase and \$2,000,000 from the Land Acquisition and Site Preparation Expenditures/Project Phase) to the Fire Station No. 47 Construction Expenditures/Project Phase as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will delay the City's ability to complete construction of the new Fire Station No. 47 to provide reduced response times and necessary emergency services in an area of the community that would otherwise remain an ISO Class 10 rated area.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment

set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an 1 amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-2 3 Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall continue in full force and effect. 4 Section 4. Effective Date.
