A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER TO

BE SICKLE CELL DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH IN

JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, September is National Sickle Cell Awareness Month; and WHEREAS, sickle cell anemia is an inherited blood disorder that mostly affects people of African ancestry, but also occurs in other ethnic groups, including people who are of Mediterranean and Middle Eastern descent; and

WHEREAS, sickle cell disease affects approximately 100,000 Americans, occurring in about 1 out of every 16,300 Hispanic American births and in about 1 out of every 365 Black or African American births, where about 1 in 13 Black or African American babies is born with sickle cell trait; and

WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is a genetic condition that is present at birth, and is inherited when a child receives two genes, one from each parent, that code for abnormal hemoglobin and can lead to chronic anemia, episodes of debilitating pain and damage to vital organs; and

WHEREAS, while the only therapy approved by the Food and Drug Administration that may be able to cure sickle cell disease is a bone marrow or stem cell transplant from a close donor match; however, early identification of a child with sickle cell disease coupled with antibiotic prophylaxis by 3 months of age and early intervention services helps those with sickle cell disease while researchers continue to search for a cure; now therefore
